Nothing Ordinary

The goal of scriptural reflection for Jewish and Christian communities is to put into practice in everyday life, serving as a guide, sustaining and nourishing our communities in our relationship with God, each other, and in our mission in/for/with the wider society. The readings of Ordinary Time for Roman Catholics are about that, about discipleship, about the meaning of following Jesus Christ in our lives and world with its many challenges and its many potentials. Starting with the beginnings of the public ministry of Jesus, his baptism, the call of the first disciples, his inaugural message about the coming reign of God, and the start of his impactful movement among the peoples of Galilee, Ordinary Time calls us to participate in the mission and message of Jesus of Nazareth in our spheres of life.

The readings of Ordinary Time also invite us to experience the energy of those early days of Jesus' galvanizing message and the transforming power of his mission among the people, to enter more deeply into his vision and "way" in a manner that makes a real-world practical difference. Together with the communal celebration of the Eucharist, the biblical texts call us to envision ourselves as participants in the stories, but more than that, as agents of Jesus' mission in/for/with the world. For its part, the Mass assures us that what we participate in and contribute to is not merely a human movement within its communities and institutions, but that this is from God. The Mass witnesses to the presence, work, and action of God in the world in and through us.

A way to live Ordinary Time through scripture is to rediscover the meaning of discipleship, to see ourselves as having been called to "follow me," to "seek first the kingdom of God and its righteousness," with all that it implies. For Christians are not only those who believe in Jesus Christ, but those who follow him by living, with the help of God's Spirit and grace, according to his teaching and indeed by his own example.


