This week's message is part of a reflection by Fr. Peter Chepaitis.

We have all been wounded by the scandal of a few priests, ministers & coaches who have sinned by abusing their power in relationship to adults, teens and even children. Our world has been threatened by leaders of nations who disregard the rights & the humanity of their neighbors and their citizens. The Good Shepherd shows us how to respond, since he was himself threatened with death as a child and abused by religious leaders and political bureaucrats as an adult.

He simply forgave. He did not excuse the wrong, the first stage of recovery is often to be very angry at the evil that is done. To forgive is not at all the same as to excuse. There is no excuse for abuse, or for terror or unprovoked war. Evil must be condemned and its victims protected. But Jesus condemned sin without rejecting the sinner. The God revealed by the prophets of Israel did the same. Good parents know the difference. they can forgive their children, even when they do not excuse their behavior when it is destructive.

To forgive as Jesus did, in the face of the evil that has been exposed in our own Church family and in the world, I must begin by forgiving myself, or rather I must let Jesus forgive me for being a part of such a wounded family, nation & world.

That's only possible, I believe, when I realize that even when I am too hurt and angry to forgive, the God revealed by Christ still has the power and desire to forgive. Sometimes I have to pray: "I can't forgive, but you, God, can. I will let you do it today. " To forgive means simply to let Jesus be the Shepherd, to give him the job of figuring it all out and of being a just and merciful judge. It means to refuse to act like those who have hurt me, and it means refusing to pass the abuse on by condemning without looking for the whole truth.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 28, 2024 - 5th Sunday of Easter

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would never prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of his Father, "He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not his work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing.

The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand-new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry

branches to the one who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.
