### 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Be strong and fear not!

Fear is a powerful emotion that grips all of us. We all feel this human emotion to some extent. We experience fear when stormy waters such as temptations, trials, and hardships befall us. Sometimes chaotic situations threaten to sink our faith and lead us to despair and be anxious.

While fear is natural we cannot allow it to dominate our lives. We all need to stay on top of this human emotion.

The readings for this Sunday tell us to be strong and fear not. The readings urge us to trust in God's saving power to calm the storms of our life and bring comfort and peace to our troubled hearts.

In the gospel, Jesus calmed the fears of his disciples who were caught in the fierce storm on the Sea of Galilee. The disciples were in a boat and hindered by strong winds and high waves. Their situation was worsened when they saw someone walking on the Sea toward them. They became more frightened because they thought that they were seeing a ghost.

Jesus addressed the fears, worry, and anxiety of his disciples. He told them "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid" (Mathew 14:13).

Peter's impulsive character got the better of him. He said to Jesus, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water" (Mathew 14:28).

He took a leap of faith and started walking on the water toward Jesus. But in the process, Peter was overcome by fear and he began to sink. He cried out for help.

Jesus stretched out his hands to save him. He got into the boat and immediately there was calm. The disciples experienced Jesus' presence and the gift of peace and serenity.

In the first reading, the prophet Elijah was overcome by fear because Queen Jezebel sought to kill him. Jezebel was a pagan woman married to King Ahab of Israel. She introduced idol worship into Israel. This pagan practice was an abomination to God's people but no one had the courage to confront Jezebel except the prophet Elijah. He mounted a crusade against Baal worship and eliminated the 450 false prophets who were influencing the Jewish people to abandon their true faith. This infuriated Jezebel and she sent soldiers to kill the prophet Elijah.

When the prophet Elijah became aware of this evil plot he fled into the desert and took shelter in a cave. He was depressed and desired to die rather than to live.

The prophet Elijah looked for a sign of God's presence in the wind, earthquake and fire but he did not find him in any of these. Finally, God appeared to the despondent Elijah in a tiny whispering sound to calm his fears. He sustained him with food and drink to continue his prophetic mission.

The experiences of the prophet Elijah and the disciples are ours as well. Like them, the wind and waves of life buffet our face and threaten to devour us. The storms of life draw us to tears but God never deserts us in our predicaments. He is there by our side in the boat of life, always ready to stretch out his hands to hold us and lead us to safety.

Let us continue to trust in God's saving power and allow him to calm the storms of our life and dispel our fears and anxieties.
