#### 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Does God demand too much of us? Does he ask us more than we can do or give him? Why should we place God first in everything? Do you and I really put him above everyone and all things? These provocative questions came to mind as I pondered on the readings for this 13th Sunday in ordinary time. The readings talk about the demands and the gains of discipleship. The readings call us to show hospitality and generosity towards others.

In the gospel, Jesus tells us to be more attached to him than everything else. He makes it clear that whoever loves father, mother, daughter, son, sister, or brother more than him is not worthy of him. God has given us our family and told us to love each member. What does Jesus mean here? Is he telling us to turn our back on our parents and family or ignore them? Not at all! He is reminding us to pay attention to our relationship with God, to love the Lord above all things.

Jesus wants us to understand what true discipleship entails, the need to surrender our lives to him completely, to take our cross and follow him to the point of death. He challenges us to go beyond our comfort zones, to forgo our self-interest, to welcome him and serve him in strangers and visitors.

We are assured of a great price or reward for accepting the call to discipleship. Jesus promises us that our smallest acts of kindness and service done in his name will be rewarded. Our kind deed such as giving a cup of cold water for others to drink will never go unnoticed.

In the first reading we find an example in a woman from Shumen who showed hospitality and generosity towards the prophet Elisha. The woman provided food for Elisha and talked to her husband to prepare a room for him to spend the night with them. Elisha was grateful for the couple's gracious hospitality and generosity toward him. He noticed their need for a child for the woman was barren. Elisha rewarded the couple's kind gesture to him with God's blessings. He said to the woman that by next year she will hold a child in her arms. This promise was fulfilled by God.

The woman and her husband had a charitable heart for God's prophet. Their charity produced fruits of blessings for them. How about us? Are we charitable to others? God opens opportunities for us to welcome him and serve him in others. He comes to us in those around us, in our neighbors, strangers, and visitors. You and I need to open our hearts to God and welcome him in these different ways and bring his presence to others.

As we celebrate the Fourth of July this weekend, let us do so with gratitude for God's blessings for our great nation and ask for his continual protection and guidance upon us. Our nation was founded on the principles of the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. As always, it is important that we pray for God's Spirit to touch our human hearts to learn to exercise our freedom wisely, to do what is right and just and be pleasing in the sight of the Lord.

We need to bring the richness of our Christian faith to others. This week, let us open our eyes to recognize the Lord in all those we may encounter; the stranger, the neighbor, the social outcast, the sick and dying and bring them the love and care they need. Let us respond to Jesus' invitation, deny ourselves, carry our cross and follow him to where he calls us to be.
