#### 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Fear is a reality of life. It is a strong emotion which alerts us to the presence of a danger or the threat of harm. We all feel fear from time to time both healthy and unhealthy ones. Healthy fear is good and beneficial. Take for example the fear of the Lord that is embedded in us. This powerful emotion keeps us on our toes to live faithful and upright lives. The fear that we have of the Lord challenges us to do what is right and just, and bring honor to God's name.

While fear can be healthy it can also be debilitating. Unhealthy fear can paralyze or cripple us. It can render us powerless or keep us from being the person God desires us to become.

God has good intentions for all his children. He does not want any of his children to live our lives in constant fear but rather with hope and courage. The Lord wants us to trust in his abiding presence with us, that he is always there by our side to pull us out of every trial or difficult situation.

In the first reading, God stood by the prophet Jeremiah in his trials and difficulties. Jeremiah became a prophet during the time when Judah was sinking in its covenant relationship with God. There were cases of religious laxity, idol worship, immoral acts and other social evils and injustices.

Jeremiah warned his contemporaries about the consequences of their actions. He pronounced doom on them. His message did not sit well with the people. They tried to silence Jeremiah with threats, intimidation, and evil plots. There were many whisperings of terror on every side to end Jeremiah's life but he did not abandon his call to preaching God's message.

Jeremiah found courage in the Lord. He trusted that God as a mighty champion, **would** protect him and deliver him from the hands of his opponents and all deadly plots.

In the gospel, Jesus exhorts us three times to be not afraid for we are worth more than many sparrows. It is comforting to know how much God cherishes and values each of us. We are precious in his sight. He has his eyes on each of us.

Jesus assures us that everything that is concealed or held secret will be uncovered and what is hidden will be brought to light. Sometimes we hide things from others. We hide our true selves, the secret part of our lives from people around us. But God is all knowing. The Lord knows all the hairs on our head. There is nothing we can hide from him. We need to surrender our lives to the Lord of life.

In the second reading, Saint Paul describes Jesus as the new Adam who brought us the free gift of salvation, new life, healing and peace. Saint Paul reminds us that the first Adam brought sin and death into the world. Adam's disobedience to God brought shame upon the whole human race. But through Jesus, the second Adam, we are reconciled to God. We are restored to grace and life.

Our Lord Jesus makes it clear that whoever acknowledges him before others, he will also acknowledge him or her before his heavenly father. He wants us to proclaim his words from the housetops and fill every corner of our small world with his presence.

This week, let us ask the Lord to help us to see in others the worth he sees in us. Let us pray for the grace to do away with our every fear and reach out to those who we find difficult to love and care for.
