5th Sunday of Easter

We are still on our Easter journey allowing our Risen Lord to open our eyes to the truth of transcendence reality. We ask for his grace and the strength to steadfastly follow his steps in the way that leads to eternal life.

The readings for this fifth Sunday of Easter talk about our share in the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. The readings remind us of our baptismal call to love and serve Christ in one another.

In the second reading, Saint Peter tells us that we are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people set apart for God's mission on earth. He helps us to know our Christian dignity, as living stones built into a spiritual household.

As baptized Christians, we share in the life and ministry of Christ in his love, trust, prayer and humble service to others.

This call to discipleship involves challenges such as we find in the first reading where the early church in Jerusalem experienced some form of internal conflict or crisis. There was dissension between the Hellenists and the Hebrews over the daily distribution of food to the widows. The Hellenists were the Jews born and bred outside Palestine. These Greek-speaking Christians complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected or overlooked in the daily distribution of material goods.

The Apostles addressed this internal conflict by appointing seven deacons filled with the Spirit and wisdom to oversee this special task so that they can devote themselves to prayer and the ministry of the word. The seven deacons worked tirelessly to serve the physical needs of the Christian community and there was peace and unity among all members.

In the gospel, Jesus spoke to his disciples about his betrayal and imminent death. This pronouncement threw the disciples into confusion, fear, and doubt for their future. Jesus told them to not let their hearts be troubled but have faith in God and faith in him. He promised to prepare a place for his disciples in his father's house and return to take them to himself so that where he is they too can be with him.

Thomas wanted be certain of where Jesus was going. He asked for a roadmap or some kind of global positioning system (GPS) that will direct him and the other disciples to God's house.

Jesus declared: "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no one comes to the father except through him."

Philip said to Jesus "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Phillip spoke on behalf of all of us. His words reveal the longing of our human hearts. We seek the face of God, to know him, love him and serve him.

It is through Jesus that we have access to God, the father. Just as Jesus has an intimate relationship with God so he invites us to be one with his father and others. As Christians we are called to bring encouragement, comfort, and hope to troubled hearts. This week let us think of how we can bring Christ's presence to others through our words and actions. Let us prove ourselves as living stones built on Christ who walk in his way, rejoice in his truth, and share in his risen life.
