6th Sunday of Easter

It is a good thing to honor our loved ones both in their lifetime and after their death. But I believe that it is more touching and beautiful when we appreciate them in their lifetime. It is important to often show to those around us how much they mean the world to us. This Sunday we take time to honor all our mothers both living and dead for their role in our lives. We thank God for all our mothers including adoptive mothers, Godmothers, grandmothers and stepmothers for their love and sacrifices for us.

We remember all of them in our prayers that God will bless them with long life, happiness and peace and for all our deceased mothers that the Lord will bring them into the joy of his kingdom.

As we enter the final weeks of Eastertide we get ourselves ready for the celebration of the feasts of the Ascension of the Lord and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. For Catholic faithful in the New York Province, each year, we observe the feast of the Ascension of the Lord on the Thursday proper. This day is a holiday of obligation. I ask all of you to please check the bulletin for the mass times and do your best to attend mass on this day.

The readings for this Sixth Sunday of Easter talk about how the Holy Spirit energized and sustained the disciples to proclaim the gospel to all peoples. The readings also bring us to reflect on how the Holy Spirit operates in our lives and enables us to live out our faith and grow in our relationship with God and others.

In the first reading, the Holy Spirit strengthened Phillip to preach the gospel to the people of Samaria. This was a hostile territory as the Samaritans did not see eye to eye with the Jews. Phillip had courage to bring God's word to the people and he made a great impression on them. Many of the people accepted the Christian faith and they were baptized. Miraculous signs and healings were performed among the people. The Apostles rejoiced when they heard about the success of Phillip's preaching ministry. They sent Peter and John to Samaria to pray with the new believers and lay hands on them. Peter and John laid hands on the new believers and they received the Holy Spirit. This action completed the Christian initiation in the new believers. It points to the bishops as the chief administrators of the sacrament of confirmation.

In the second reading, Peter calls us to good conduct, to defend our faith with patience, gentleness and respect even in the face of hostility or persecution. He tells us to be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks us the reason for our hope.

Our hope is based on Jesus who is constantly with us through the Holy Spirit. He empowers us to live out our faith and remain connected to him.

In the gospel, Jesus assured his disciples that he will not leave them orphans but that he will ask his father to send them another Advocate to defend, strengthen and instruct them in their ministry. He promised to send them the Spirit of Truth to remind them of all that he taught them.

Jesus talked about the need to keep to his commandments. For him, keeping to his commandments is a true sign of love. It is the way by which we express our love for him. If we love him, he and his father will love us in return and he will reveal himself to us.

How do you and I prove our love for God? We show our love for God when we reach out to others and serve their needs. We keep to Christ's commandment when we follow his way of sacrificial and selfgiving love and seek the good and the interest of others.

We need the wisdom and guidance of Christ to live the life of faith, hope, and love. Like the disciples and the early Christian believers let us remain docile to the Holy Spirit and continue in our baptismal vocation to bear witness to Christ by word and deed.

As we gather around the table of the Lord to share in his living word and the bread of life, let us find reason to praise God for his love and goodness for our lives. Let us praise the Lord for his intimate presence in our lives and for our mothers who show us tender love and kindness.
