33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Harnessing our God-given gifts and talents

God has blessed each one of us with special gifts, talents, and abilities. As recipients, we are expected to harness these gifts and talents and use them to serve other people and to glorify God.

This Sunday's gospel text reminds us that someday we will be held accountable for our God-given gifts and talents. We find this truth in the parable of the talents. Jesus tells us that a master entrusted his possessions to his three servants and then went on a long journey. The master gave five talents to one servant, two talents to another and a talent to the other servant, each according to one's ability. Upon his return, the master summoned his three servants for a reckoning. He asked what each of them did with his talents.

The first servant did well to trade with his talents and made an additional five in return. Likewise, the servant with two talents invested it and made two more. The master praised both servants for their initiative in putting their talents into profitable use. He rewarded them with additional duties to be in charge of other cities.

The third servant, however, buried his talent in the ground so he made nothing in return. He confessed that he feared his master as a hard person. He did not want to take risk in trading with his master's money in case he loses it.

The master scolded the third servant for his laziness, lack of courage, initiative and creativity. He condemned him to eternal punishment.

What lesson do you and I draw from this parable? What are our God-given gifts, talents and abilities? Are we using them or hiding them?

The parable challenges all of us to overcome the fear of failure, to make the most use of our gifts and talents for the good and benefit of other people.

In the first reading, we learn from the example of the worthy wife whose faithfulness serves as a blessing to many. The book of proverbs describes an ideal woman who reflects God's goodness through her service and care for those around her. The worthy woman puts her gifts and talents at the disposal of her family and her local community.

Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading to be awake and ready so the Lord's return does not catch us off guard like a thief who comes at night and unannounced. He urges all of us to live each day as children of the light.

The day of the Lord may seem to be long delayed but it will certainly come someday. It will come at the moment or the hour of our death.

Until then, we are called to recognize the talents within us and to use them to serve God and others. We are called to bring love, compassion, care, and healing to those in need.

Let us all do our best to live as responsible and faithful servants of the Lord so on the last day he may say to each of us "Come, you who are blessed by my father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Mathew 25: 34).

It is my prayer that as we gather around the Thanksgiving table with our family, friends, and all loved ones, this Thursday, our hearts and minds may be filled with gratitude to God for all his goodness and love to us. I wish all of you, your family, and loved ones a wonderful Thanksgiving Thursday! God bless.
