23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Be Thy Neighbor's Keeper

We travel in this earthly life not only as individuals but also as a community and companions encouraging and correcting one another to become who God intends each of us to be.

God wants us to be our neighbor's keeper and help one another on the way to salvation.

In the first reading, God appointed Ezekiel as a watchman over the house of Israel. He called Ezekiel to guide his people and warn them to turn away from sin and wickedness.

God made it clear to Ezekiel that he will hold him responsible for the soul of the sinner if he fails to speak out and try to correct the sinner.

In the gospel, Jesus talks about the need for forgiveness and reconciliation in our lives. He gives us a three-step procedure on how to offer fraternal correction and to help repair or mend broken relationships.

In the first step, Jesus tells us to approach the person who offended or hurt us and talk to him or her privately. In case this attempt fails, we should go an extra mile to bring one or two others with us to resolve the dispute. And if the second approach fails, we should seek the help of the Christian community. Jesus tells us that if reconciliation does not occur in the end, we should treat the person as a Gentile or a tax collector.

Fraternal correction is important for the wellbeing of individuals, family and community but it is a difficult and challenging task. This work requires courage, compassion, patience, humility and gentleness and prudence. We need these qualities in order to speak the truth and help others to know their mistakes and change for the better.

But sometimes we take delight in spreading the mistakes of others around through gossip. This behavior does not help to bring about healing and restoration.

On the other hand, many of us find it hard to accept correction from others. We think that we are always right and others are wrong. Such attitude sabotages reconciliation and the healing process and it goes a long way to damage our relationships with others.

Some of us harbor ill-feelings or hold grudges against others. Perhaps you and I have not spoken to a family member, a sister or a brother, a relative or a friend for a long time due to feelings of resentment and hurts.

Yes, it is upsetting when someone offends or hurts us but as Christians it is important that we do well to overcome this human emotion. We should try to correct wrongdoing not in anger but in love and charity. It is this Christlike attitude that can help us to be true watchmen for our sisters or brothers and bring them on the right track.

Saint Paul urges us in the second reading to live in mutual love. He says that love does no evil to the neighbor. The Psalmist also reminds us that if today we hear the Lord's voice, we should not harden our hearts. All of us have thoughts, feelings and actions that we need to surrender to the Lord. Let us open our hearts to God's message and walk on the path of righteousness so we too can be watchmen for others. This week, let us all do our best to be thy neighbor's keeper.
