## Third of Sunday of Easter Companions on the journey of life

We extend a warm welcome to Fr. Peter Anglaaere who will be with us while Fr. Ben is on a vacation to Ghana. Fr. Peter is a priest of the Arch-Diocese of Tamale, Ghana. We are glad to have him in our midst and hope that he will feel at home with us.

The readings for this Third Sunday of Easter bring us to reflect on God's continuing presence in our lives. The readings talk about how God comes to us in unfamiliar guises to support and strengthen us on the road of life.

In the gospel, the Risen Lord appeared as a stranger to two of his disciples Cleopas and an unnamed disciple, and walked with them on the road to Emmaus. These disciples were grief stricken, confused, and disillusioned about the horrible crucifixion and excruciating death of Jesus. Everything seemed lost to them as they hoped that Jesus would redeem Israel from the oppressive rule of the Roman government.

The Risen Lord walked alongside the two disciples but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He joined in their conversation and interpreted for them what referred to him in the scriptures. He opened their minds to understand that as Christ he had to suffer, die, and rise again in order to pave the way of salvation to all people.

When the two disciples reached their destination, they invited the stranger (Jesus) to stay with them for the day was almost over. And while they were at table, their eyes were opened to Jesus' presence in the breaking of the bread but he vanished from their midst.

Cleopas and his companion were filled with joy and they hurried back to Jerusalem to share their experience with the other disciples. They recounted what took place on the road and how their hearts burned within them as Jesus spoke to them. While they were speaking, the Risen Lord appeared in their midst, gave them the gift of peace and commissioned them to be witnesses of his resurrection and redemptive work

The Emmaus story is about our own life journey. All of us walk down this road which is sometimes filled with hope and hopelessness, joy and sadness. We travel on this path when family crisis, ill health, death of loved ones, financial unrest hit us. Such difficult moments push us to the edge to feel wearied, despondent and downcast. But we are never alone in our struggles and challenges. The Risen Lord draws near to each of us and walks by our side. He talks to us like he did with the disciples on the road, to dispel our fears, ignite our faith and rekindle hope in our hearts. As we gather around the table of the Lord to share in his word and break bread together, let us do so with gratitude in our hearts for the depth of his love for us. Let us ask our Risen Lord to open our eyes to his presence in the many guises he comes to us; in the scriptures, in the breaking of the bread, prayer and our fellowship.

Like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, let us accompany one another on the journey of faith and with the strength from on high strive to be fearless witnesses of the Lord in word and deed.
