5th Sunday in Ordinary Time This weekend we will offer the blessing of the throats at all of our masses immediately after the homily. We will implore the intercession of Saint Blaise for God's protection and healing upon ourselves and all the sick. Tradition has it that Saint Blaise, a fourth-century bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and a martyr, miraculously cured a young boy who was choked with fishbone. Since the eight century, the church has prayed through his intercession for deliverance from afflictions of the throat and other illnesses.

In today's liturgy, our readings bring us to reflect on the fundamental issue of human suffering and pain. The readings exhort us to face the realities of life with confidence and trust in God's saving love.

In the first reading, we learn about how Job wrestled with his faith and the meaning of suffering. Job was a righteous and loyal servant of God yet he experienced so much misery and anguish. He was beset with tragedy after another; from sickness to the brutal loss of his property, and family. Job got to a point where he could no longer bear with the afflictions and misfortunes of life. He was overcome by despair and lamented that life on earth is nothing but drudgery. He never hoped to see happiness again.

Nevertheless, Job trusted in God's benevolence. He exclaimed, "The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job 1: 21).

Suffering and pain come to all of us at different times and in different guises. They come to us in ill-health, sickness, loss of a loved one, financial problem, family crises or broken relationships. Sometimes trials and tribulations push us beyond the limits of endurance. The afflictions in life leave us with sleepless nights and make us despair.

Job's experience shows us how to navigate the storm of life with an unwavering faith in God. It teaches all of us about the need for courage, endurance, and prayer in our lives.

In the gospel, Jesus reached out to the sick and the suffering people with love and compassion. He healed Peter's mother-in-law who was sick in bed with a sever fever. He took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, Jesus cured many people who were sick with various diseases and delivered those who were tormented by demons. He later moved on to preach the good news of salvation in the nearby villages.

After a long day work, Jesus got up early the next morning and went off to a deserted place to pray. In doing this, he taught us the importance of prayer in our lives. Jesus showed us the need to be in constant communication with our heavenly father and draw divine strength to do God's work on earth.

In the second reading, Saint Paul talked about his own ministry as an Apostle. Saint Paul dedicated himself completely to God's service and became all things to all people. He preached the gospel as well as supported and nurtured the faith of the Christian communities.

All of us share in the mission of the Lord. We are called to proclaim the good news, to bring hope to broken hearts and healing to the suffering people. As we encounter the Lord in his word and the Eucharist, let us all seek to be instruments of his love and healing in the world. Let us pray to God for respite and energy to live each day with trust and hope in his saving love amidst the sufferings and challenges of life.
