Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Today is the second Sunday after Christmas and it marks the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany comes from the Greek word 'epiphaneia' which means manifestation, revelation, or making known. So today, we celebrate God's manifestation to the whole world. And on Monday we commemorate another epiphany, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This is an event where Christ was revealed to the whole world as the only Begotten Son of God. The feast of the Baptism of the Lord concludes our Christmas season and ushers us into the ordinary time of the church's liturgical year.

The readings for today's feast talk about God's universal gift of salvation. The readings highlight the fact that God's saving love is for all peoples and not for a chosen few.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah foretold that God will restore Jerusalem to her former glory by shining the radiance of his light upon her. The prophet Isaiah foresaw that all nations will stream to the holy city in Jerusalem led by God's radiant light and those from Sheba shall come bearing gold and incense in their hands to adore the Lord (Isaiah 60:6). Isaiah's prophecy was fulfilled in the visit of the Magi who came from the East to adore the infant Jesus in Bethlehem. The Magi are also called the three kings or the wise men. They represent all nations and peoples who search diligently for God.

In the gospel, Mathew recounted that the Magi saw a bright star in the sky and they followed it to Jerusalem to look for the newborn king of the Jews. The journey of the Magi was uneasy. They experienced darkness because the star guiding them disappeared but they did not abandon their search. They asked questions and sought guidance and directions to come to God's presence.

The star appeared again and led them to the place of the Christ child where they prostrated themselves and offered him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These gifts are symbolic. The gold represents Christ Kingship and power, frankincense his divinity and priestly ministry, and myrrh his passion and death.

After being warned in a dream the Magi returned to their country by another route. They listened to God's voice and did not go back to Herod. You and I have the spirit of these folks within us. We have something of their quest, the desire for God's light and wisdom in our lives. We have seen the star of Bethlehem and we continue follow it in our pilgrimage of life. This bright star has led us here to today's Mass to pay homage to the Christ child and to be nourished spiritually by his word and the Eucharist. Like the Magi, we come with grateful hearts to offer to God the gifts of ourselves, the gold of our obedience to his will, the incense of our prayers and the myrrh of our humble deeds. And we return to our homes in a different way. We resolve to not go back to the evil and wicked ways of Herod such as hatred, anger, aggressiveness, violence, and destruction but rather to show love, compassion, kindness, and care toward others. Let us pray that in this New Year, we may all strive to be little epiphanies and inspire others to embrace the light of Christ in their lives through our words and actions.
