2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Christmas season is over and we are now into the ordinary time of the church year. The ordinary time is the longest part of the liturgical year during which we grow our Christian faith and strive to be better followers of Jesus Christ.

On this second Sunday in ordinary time our readings focus on the theme of the call and response to discipleship. In both the first reading and the gospel, we hear of two powerful stories about those who heard God's call and their humble response to the Lord.

In the first reading, God called the young Samuel to be a prophet. Samuel was the son of Hannah and Elkanah whom God blessed in their old age. Hannah was barren and she made a solemn promise to God that she would dedicate her child to his service if he granted her a son. She kept her promise by taking Samuel to the temple of Shiloh and placed him in the care of Eli, the priest. One night, while Samuel was sleeping in the temple where the Ark of the Covenant was kept, he heard a voice calling him. He got up and went to Eli thinking it was he who called him. The call did not come from Eli so he told Samuel to go back to bed. This happened three times.

After three distinct calls, Eli understood the voice to be coming from the Lord and he instructed Samuel to say: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."

With this response, Samuel expressed his openness and willingness to be at God's service and his people. His answer to God's call reflects the responsorial psalm for today's liturgy, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

In the gospel, John the Baptist saw Jesus passed by and he pointed him out to two of his disciples. He declared, "Look! There is the Lamb of God!"

The two disciples left John the Baptist and followed Jesus. Andrew was one of them and he brought his brother Simon to meet Jesus. When Jesus saw the two brothers following him, he asked them the question: What are you looking for." This is a good question for each of us too. What are we looking for in life?

Andrew and his brother Simon expressed their desire to see where Jesus lives and the Lord invited them to come and see.

The Lord constantly calls people to his service like he did with Samuel and the first disciples. Some of us heard God's voice and we made a personal commitment to follow him in the priesthood, diaconate, religious, marriage, or single life. We each need to be always attentive to our individual vocation, to follow the Lord and bring others to God's presence.

As Christian parents and teachers we have a responsibility and religious duty to help our children and young people to recognize God's voice in their lives. We all know the many competing voices and interests that surround our children and young people and hinder their spiritual growth and relationship with God. They need our inspiration, guidance, and direction to know the Lord and always discern his divine will and plan for their lives.

Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit so we should not use them for evil purposes. Saint Paul urges us to avoid all immorality including fornication, excessive consumption of alcohol, illicit drug use and intentional self-harm because these things are destructive.

As people made in the image and likeness of God, let us all strive to overcome the desires of our sinful natures and always do what is right, good, and pleasing to the Lord.
