## 5th Sunday of Lent

From death into life

Death isn't a favorite subject for most people. For many, thinking about death brings them overwhelming feelings of discomfort, fear, and panic. It brings pain and sorrow to their hearts. But as human beings, we cannot avoid or ignore the reality of death because it is part and parcel of our life. We should always be ready to face this reality of life.

Jesus was like us in all things except in sin. He experienced anguish as he approached his own impending death. We find evidence of this in today's gospel. Jesus was deeply troubled in soul but he remained obedient to his father's will. He prayed to God for the strength to suffer death on the Cross and to bring us new life.

Jesus announced to his disciples that the hour has come for him (son of man) to be glorified. The kind of hour that he referred to here is his passion, death, and resurrection. It is an hour of his self-sacrificial love for the world.

Jesus used nature as a metaphor to teach us the necessity of death. He pointed out that death leads to new life. He stated that "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (John 12:24).

This statement is a powerful paradox of life. It refers to Jesus himself and all of us. Jesus sacrificed his life for our salvation. He was the grain of wheat that fell on the ground and produced new life for us. We are all called to pattern our lives after that of Jesus.

We too need to die to ourselves, to let go of our selfish desires and live for others.

Jesus tells us that it is in dying to ourselves that we can truly share in his new life. He invites us to follow his footsteps of selflessness and sacrificial love.

In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah talks about God's desire to transform us into a new creation. He reminds us that like the house of Israel and Judah, God will make a covenant with us by placing his laws in our hearts. This new and eternal covenant was established in Christ through the blood he shed for us on the cross and restored us to God.

The psalmist echoes the message of the prophet Jeremiah by inviting us to a renewal of our lives. He calls us to implore God to create a clean heart in us and renew a steadfast spirit within us.

In the second reading, the author of the book of the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus became a source of eternal life for us through his suffering and death on the Cross.

Our Lord Jesus continues to offer prayers and supplications to God on our behalf. Let us thank him for his sacrificial love for us and the salvation he won for us on the Cross.

Let us pray for the grace to follow in his footsteps and strive to spend our lives in self-giving and sacrificial service to his church and all others.

I wish all of you a wonderful Saint Patrick's Day this Sunday! God bless.
