Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity-Living in God's Innermost Life

Humanity is blessed with many beautiful realities, and among the greatest is our capacity to live within mystery-to trust what we cannot see and to embrace what we cannot fully comprehend. On this Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity; reaffirming our belief in one God in three divine Persons-Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We profess the truth of the Godhead: that the divine Persons share one divine substance, perfectly united, without division or rivalry. Although this mystery surpasses our understanding, it does not diminish its truth; rather it draws us into God's innermost nature.

We live this mystery daily. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, recall our baptism, or lift our hearts in prayer, we enter the life of the Godhead. We acknowledge the Father who is the eternal source of all life and love, the Son, the Word made flesh who reveals the Father's mercy to the world; and the Spirit who guides, comforts, and leads us into all truth. Through the Trinity, we are drawn into the communion of God's love and share in His very life. In the first reading, Moses encounters the Lord on Mount Sinai, where God reveals Himself as merciful, gracious, slow to anger, rich in kindness and fidelity. Moses places his trust in the Lord's presence and bows down in worship.

The psalmist echoes this praise, proclaiming God's majesty and holiness. In the second reading, Saint Paul blesses the Christian community at Corinth with a triune benediction, urging them and us to reflect God's unity through our words and actions.

In the Gospel, Jesus unveils the depth of the Father's love through the Son, whom He sent not to condemn but to save, so that all may have eternal life. He shows us the way to salvation-a life of faithfulness in the Godhead.

As disciples, our faith moves us to profess and witness to the Godhead in our daily lives. We do this by mirroring His nature in our relationships and becoming agent of forgiveness, unity, harmony, and peace.

We trust in God and in the abundance of His grace to draw us into His life. May He lead us ever more deeply into His divine communion and strengthen our witness to His saving love, so that others may behold the splendor of His innermost nature.
