St. Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day—April 17th

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was born at Auriesville, New York, in 1656 to a Christian Algonquin and a Mohawk Indian chief. She suffered the loss of her father and mother at the age of four in an epi-

demic of smallpox which left her disfigured. In 1675, she embraced the Catholic faith through her contacts with Jesuit missionaries, namely Fr. Jacques de Lamberville. Her strong faith caused her to be persecuted among her own people, so she journeyed nearly 200 miles to a Christian Indian village near Montreal, Canada. While there, Kateri dedicated her life to God and lived an exemplary Christian life. She died in 1680 at the age of twenty-four at Caughnawaga, Canada. She is known as the Lily of the Mohawks and her example has inspired the Indian communities of North America. (reprinted from The Book of Saints, Regina Press, 2010)
