The Intention Net will be up for the entire Easter Season. Please pray for the intentions placed on the net and for any



St. Joseph Prayer Shawl Ministry





St. Francis of Paola Feast Day—April 2nd

St. Francis was born about the year 1416 in the town of Paola in southern Italy. Devoted to his patron, St. Francis of Assisi, he lived humbly and simply. He was educated by the Franciscans at San Marco and went to live as a hermit in a cave at the age of fifteen. Five years later, in 1436, two companions joined him. This date is believed to be the origin of his religious community of men known as the Minims. The

at the age of fifteen. Five years later, in 1436, two companions joined him. This date is believed to be the origin of his religious community of men known as the Minims. The community was officially recognized by Rome in 1474 and called the Hermits of St. Francis. In 1492, they changed their name to the Minim Friars. Francis impressed not only his neighbors, but also kings and high officials because of his simple wisdom and his ability to read the human heart.

In 1481, Pope Sixtus IV summoned Francis to France to see if he could cure King Louis XI, who was seriously ill. Though King Louis XI died, Francis made a profound impression on Charles VIII, the king's son. Charles became both a friend and benefactor of Francis and had monasteries built in France and Rome for the Minims. Francis died at Plessis, France, on Good Friday at the age of ninety-one. The year was 1507.(reprinted from The Book of Saints, Regina Press, 2010)
