#### Thérèse of Lisieux

Called "the greatest saint of modern times" by Pope St. Pius X, Thérèse of Lisieux lived a hidden life in a Carmelite monastery and died at only



twenty-four years old. Yet, her "secret" of sanctity has made her not only a great modern saint, but a Doctor of the Church. She promised to spend her Heaven helping those on earth. Her simple spirituality, humility, and complete trust in God revolutionized the twentieth century. Over 100 years after her death, she continues to inspire millions of people, help them in their lives, and draw them closer to God.

This film tells the story of her life and message, intertwined with the personal stories of twelve people from around the world who testify to the great impact Thérèse has made on their lives. Including very rare footage of the inside of her monastery at Lisieux, we also meet a taxi driver in Rome, a famous radio priest in the Netherlands, a wedding dress designer in Paris, a teenager in Lebanon, a Protestant professor at Harvard Divinity School, a mother of twelve children in Nigeria, a stockbroker on Wall Street, and others, who share their moving personal stories of how Thérèse, and her "secret," has changed their lives. Her secret is so powerful that it confirms her mission to "Love Jesus and to make Him loved by others."

# Our Lady of the Rosary Feast Day—October 7<sup>th</sup>

"The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted to honor Mary for the Christian victory over the Turks at Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

Pope St. Pius V and all Christians had prayed the Rosary for victory." The Rosary, or the Psalter of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is one of the best prayers to Mary, the Mother of God.

#### Our Lady of the Rosary

This feast was instituted by Pope St. Pius V in thanksgiving for the great naval victory over the Turks at the battle of Lepanto on this day in the year 1570, a favor due to the recitation of the Rosary. This victory saved Europe from being overrun by the forces of Islam. Lepanto, perhaps the most complete victory ever gained over the Ottoman Empire, on October 7, 1571, is commemorated by the invocation "Help of Christians," inserted in the Litany of Loretto. At Belgrade, the Turks were defeated on the Feast of Our Lady ad Nives in 1716. A second victory gained that year on the Octave of the Assumption determined Pope Clement XI to command the Feast of the Rosary to be celebrated by the universal Church. Leo XIII added the invocation "Queen of the most Holy Rosarv, pray for us," to the Litany of Loretto. The Feast is in reality a great festival of thanksgiving for the signal and countless benefits bestowed on Christendom through the Rosary of our blessed Oueen.

The word *Halloween* is really just a reconstructed version of *Hallows' Eve* 

- "Hallow" means "holy" or "saint"
- **"E'en"** is simply short for "evening"

So, Halloween literally means the Eve of All Saints Day-a vigil before one of the Church's greatest feast days.

Catholics are generally aware that many saints have feast days in the liturgical calendar. However, there are only 365 days in the year, so All Saints Day provides a chance to celebrate and commemorate every soul in heaven.

From the earliest days f Christianity, Catholics honored the martyrs and saints with prayer vigils on this "saints' evening." Candles lit up the night, reminding the faithful that the lives of the saints bring light into a darkened world. All Saints' Day (November 1st) and All Soul's Day (November 2nd) became the anchor of this holy season, turning late October into a time of reflection on heaven, holiness, and the hope of eternal life.

This October the Discipleship Formation will be having their All-Saints group class and they also will be having Halloween at St. Joseph's Church. If anyone would like to donate candy for the month of October there will be marked candy in the parish hall in which you may place the candy. Thank you and God Bless!!
