WELCOME TO 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR!


We are very excited to begin a partnership with your family as your child begins their educational journey at CTK.

Curric

Utilization of the Ages & Stages screening tool will be completed in November. The Brigance Inventory of Early Development tool will be completed in February and June. Progress reports and subsequent parent-teacher conferences will be conducted 2 times or more as needed. ESL assessments, and the appropriate referrals for support will be conducted as needed via district Committee for Preschool Special Education.. The NYS Early Learning Guidelines will be utilized as a baseline criteria for quality program content.





Environment

Classrooms are designed to provide engaging areas for children to work in. Community and center areas enable students to select leaning activities based on their interests. The ERS3 (Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale) is used to assess the classroom environment, materials and relationships with all stakeholders. Pro-social behavioral strategies will be an integral component of our programs, designed to encourage positive interactions, communication and problem solving skills for children in early educational group settings.

Enrichment Specials

Science, Music, Literacy Enrichment, Creative Expression & Foreign Language

Students will benefit from various instruction throughout the year. Weekly specials will also be facilitated over 9 week periods. These include music, science, foreign language and literacy enrichment!. Your child's teacher will share their Enrichment Specials schedule with you.

Pre-K classes will have gym class twice per week. Please make sure your child has the proper footwear. In addition to gross motor play in the gymnasium, classrooms will go outside everyday weather permitting. Your child's teacher will share their class gym schedule with you. When going outside, children will assist in applying sunscreen lotion per state regulations, year round.

All paperwork is due no later than 9/1/23. Tuition is expected to be paid by first day of each month through Tuition Express. Late fees will be automatically assessed for late payments and returned payments. Children who require medication or have allergies must contact the office to obtain NYS OCFS forms & submit correct paperwork to the EC office prior to enrollment.

All are welcome at Christ the King Early Childhood Center! As a state funded program, religious instruction is not permitted within UPK programs, however we do include the tenants of character education and service to others in the community. The ECC is known for celebrating holidays and other important occasions within many cultures. Extended care will include religious components as practiced in the majority of our programs.



Snack/Lunch Time

Classrooms may be peanut & tree nut free if a student with an allergy is enrolled. Families provide a morning snack, beverage, lunch and afternoon snack if enrolled in extended care. One day each month, parents may opt to purchase a pizza lunch for their child(ren). Please send in healthy food & beverage items (we can refrigerate and heat up). Please note it is our policy to discard all peanut/tree nut products due to airborne allergens if your child's classroom is nut free. All lunch pail items must be labeled. Meals will be conducted family style, so that we can use the opportunity for further learning opportunities.

Extended Care

Families who require extended care (between the hours of 7:30-8 AM and 1-:530 PM) will need to register with the CTK ECC office. A non-refundable registration fee (\$100) and a materials fee (\$50) will be charged. On school district days & weeks off care will be available if a minimum of 8 children sign up for the day/week. Additional charges are assessed for half and full days of care and can be found on our registration form. PLEASE NOTE: THE CENTER WILL CLOSE @ 4 PM ON THE 3RD THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH FOR STAFF MEETINGS.

Service

An integral component of our programs, **community service**, to those less fortunate teaches children social responsibility and altruism. Developing objectives, teamwork skills, and compassion for others builds self-esteem and a sense of accomplishment. Fulfilling our mission of service to children & families, students contributions to the larger community positively impacts everyone.
