

- 1:30pm: Prayer Service (Collectio) begins at Historic Saint Mary's
- Pilgrimage begins after the Prayer Service (Collectio), half mile prayerful procession to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception
- **3pm:** Mass begins at the Cathedral. Bishop Edward Scharfenberger presides.

Parking Options:

- Park at the Cathedral (in the lot behind the Cathedral or parking garage across the street).
 - If you plan to take part in the walk (pilgrimage), you can park at the Cathedral. A shuttle bus arrives at the Cathedral at 1pm to take you to Saint Mary's. The shuttle is for walkers only. **There is NO RETURN SHUTTLE.**

- Park at Historic Saint Mary's keep in mind, it will be dark when Mass ends at the Cathedral and you have to walk back to your car at Saint Mary's.

EPIPHANY BLESSING, EXPLAINED

The Epiphany household blessing is a centuries-old tradition that invokes God's blessing on all who enter one's home.

All you need for an Epiphany blessing is chalk, which is usually made available by parishes either on the feast of the Epiphany or in the weeks leading up to it. There are a few different formulas for blessings out there, but the essence of the ritual is always the same: a priest or the head of the household calls down God's blessing on the house and everyone who comes into it, and an inscription is made above the door in chalk.

The inscription reads: the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the year. The initials C, M and B represent the names of the magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar and also signify the Latin phrase Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." ©LPi
