

Food Pantries Supporting our Neighbors in Need

Did you know? In the Northeast New York Food Bank's 23county service area, 12.2% of the population, more than 355,000 people, experience food insecurity. A staggering 15.4% of children experience food insecurity.

How can you help?

All churches have collection buckets near the entrance for nonperishable donations

Financial donations can be made at any time by placing your contribution in an envelope labeled "Food Pantry" and drop it in any collection basket at Mass or mail to the parish office.

Special Needs

We are seeking volunteers to drive to the Regional Food Bank in Latham (just off exit 4 of the Northway) to "Shop the Dock" (select fresh produce stored in a walk in cooler that is available at little to no cost).

The volunteer delivers the food to the Pantry where other volunteers help unload it and arrange it on tables before the pantry opens. The frequency of trips is usually 2-4 times a month. (Mondays for St. Paul's Pantry and Wednesday mornings for St. Joseph's Pantry)

Reimbursement for trip mileage is available.

Sts. Peter And Paul, Apostles

What do you call brothers who are born on the same day? Twins, of course. That is what we celebrate today in the inestimable saints, Peter and Paul. Wait: twins? Yes. The early Church believed that Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome on the same day. Since the day of martyrdom is celebrated as a saints' birth into eternal life, the result is striking: Peter and Paul are twins in God's family, the Church.

Who should care about this? Well, anyone who longs to live in a world marked by love and peace. Remember, the Romans believed that twins, Romulus and Remus, founded their city through an act of fratricide, the former murdering the latter. Sadly, the structures of this fallen world emerge through violence between those who should love each other. But in the Church, a new city has been founded upon this new set of twins, embodying the nonviolent power of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

That's why traditional icons represent Peter and Paul in a fraternal and warm embrace. Contrasted with the violence of Rome's founders, it challenges us with a bold claim: do we believe that structures of merciful love are more powerful and lasting than those based on power, violence, and domination? Am I willing to see others in my life as my "twin," with whom I am called to give my life for Christ, or as my rival? Am I committed to living what is embodied in Romulus and Remus, or in Peter and Paul? — Father John Muir ©LPi
