



Carlo's story has profoundly touched our lives. From discovering his witness for the first time, to walking in his footsteps in Assisi, to helping bring his story to the screen.


This journey has been one of grace, friendship, and unexpected miracles. His message continues to inspire us, and we believe it will do the same for you.
