Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 16:21-27

Do you know what it is like to be thrilled by the power of Christian faith one moment and then utterly fail in it the next? I do. That is Peter in today's Gospel. After last week's bold confession, he now hears Jesus speak of suffering and death, and something in him recoils. He takes Jesus aside and tries to correct him. Jesus responds with the shocking rebuke, "Get behind me, Satan."

Peter is the mirror of every disciple. We love Jesus until he contradicts the script we have written for our lives. Peter does not reject Jesus. He rejects a suffering Jesus. So do we, whenever we avoid a hard responsibility, resist a demanding relationship, or cling to comfort instead of choosing love. We want a Lord who supports our plans, not one who overturns them.

Yet Jesus does not discard Peter. He redirects him. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." In effect, Jesus says, stop trying to lead me. Let me lead you. Discipleship does not begin with heroism or clarity but with surrender. It means trusting that God's path to life often passes through places we would never choose.

Peter is all of us. We move from insight to confusion, from confidence to correction. That is why we should have hope. Jesus patiently teaches us again and again. Trust me. Get behind me. Follow me. When we stop fighting the crosses that come and start carrying them with him, we discover a freedom deeper than comfort and a love stronger than fear.

LWC Leaders & Assistants Needed

Liturgy of the Word with Children (LWC) is the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly before the Liturgy of the Word and gathering elsewhere to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to their level of understanding.

In 1973, the Congregation for Divine Worship in Rome issued the document Directory for Masses with Children It states: Sometimes..., if the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the liturgy of the word, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant, room. Then, before the eucharistic liturgy begins, the children are led to the place where the adults have meanwhile celebrated their own liturgy of the word (DMC #17). The purpose of adapting liturgical celebrations to make them more accessible to children must always be to gradually lead them to full, conscious and active participation in the Sunday liturgical assembly.

The Leaders and children in kindergarten - third grade will be called forward immediately before the first reading and return before the collection.

LWC will be held during the 10:30 am Mass at St. Joseph's on the same Sundays as Faith Formation classes (twice a month.)

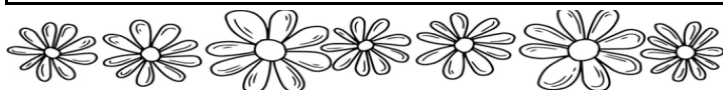

Cathy Lozier, Parish Bookkeeper, presented the Financial Reports for the end of fiscal year 2025-2026, which ended June 30, 2026. It is notable that overall income was up more than 13% from the previous fiscal year. Father Simon reported that the Diocese had said that our sacrificial offering to the Bankruptcy Settlement Fund should be taken from our Endowment by the end of September 2026. The Vision of Stewardship

I love the original movie Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory. All the way through while I watch the film I still laugh and feel like a child. It is only the last line with which I have an issue. Wonka by now has chosen Charlie to succeed him as head of the chocolate factory. They board an elevator that proceeds to crash through the roof and begins to fly. Wonka then asks Charlie if he ever heard of what happened to the boy who got everything he ever wanted. After Charlie says no, Wonka explains, "He lived happily ever after." As I get older, I can say I have met several people who got all or most of all they have ever wanted, but unlike Charlie, it did not lead to endless bliss. In fact, as a Christian I know that that statement of Wonka's is a lie. The secret to living happily ever after lies in not getting all you ever wanted, but instead in giving all you ever wanted away.

A person can't have any sense of that reality until they begin to see his or her life transformed by Jesus. When we have accepted the challenge placed before us and made a choice to live a certain way daily, we can find ourselves transformed. Following Jesus is not easy, but it is the only true way to find authentic joy. When we have emptied ourselves and allowed him to fill the open spaces in us, we become different. We are transformed and, if enough of us in a parish community experience the same journey, our parish is transformed as well. Then we begin to transform the world around us. Don't be fooled: A flying elevator is cool, but it pales in comparison to what can happen when we find a new life in Jesus Christ.

Did you know?

Catholics must abstain from all food and drink for **at least one hour** before receiving Holy Communion. As outlined in the [USCCB Guidelines for the Reception of Communion](#), this fast is a sign of spiritual preparation and reverence.

Key Rules of the Eucharistic Fast

- **Timeframe:** The one-hour countdown is measured back from the moment you actually **receive Holy Communion**, not from the start time of the Mass.

- **Allowed:** Plain water and necessary medicines can be consumed at any time before Communion.

Not Allowed: All other food and drinks (including coffee, tea, juice, milk, and chewing gum) break the fast.

Exemptions

The Sick and Elderly: Those who are ill, infirm, or advanced in age, along with those who care for them, are excused from this fasting requirement.

No Communion, No Obligation: If you do not plan to receive Holy Communion at Mass (or if you are attending but not Catholic), the one-hour fast is not strictly obligatory, though respectful preparation is still encouraged.
