18th Sunday in Ordinary Time Work for food that endures to eternal life (John 6:24)

As humans, we experience two types of hungers: physical and spiritual hungers. But many a time, we focus so much on our physical selves and not on our soul and what it needs. We allow our bodily or physical needs to overshadow our spiritual wants.

The readings for this Sunday teach us to prioritize our spiritual sustenance over our physical needs or material security. The readings challenge and encourage us to be more concerned with spiritual food than with physical food. They urge us to fill up our spiritual hunger with God's presence, his living word and the Holy Eucharist.

In the first reading, the whole Israelite community experienced physical hunger and thirst in the desert. The people of Israel were on their journey to the Promised Land. In their desperation, the pilgrim people murmured against Moses and God for bringing them out of Egypt to suffer in the desert. They complained that their situation was worse off than when they were under bondage in Egypt. They preferred to be slaves in Egypt rather than being brought into the desert to die of famine.

God heard the grumbling of his pilgrim people. He responded to their cry by providing them with manna and quails from heaven to eat. He also gave them plenty of water to drink and to quench their thirst.

The Psalmist invites us to sing God's praises for his goodness, benevolence and divine providence for us. He says that God provides us bread from heaven to satisfy our spiritual hunger and sustain us on our earthly journey to his eternal kingdom.

In his letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul urges us to turn away from our former way of life and put on the new self that is created in Christ. Saint Paul exhorts us to walk in Christ's ways of love, kindness, and compassion so we can find true nourishment to sustain our life journey.

In the gospel, Jesus challenged the crowd to seek what truly endures. The crowd looked for Jesus because he miraculously fed them with five barley loaves of bread and two fish. He provided them with free lunch and they had their fill. Jesus did not want the people to follow him for wrong reasons. He told them to not work for food that perishes but rather for food that endures to eternal life.

Jesus declared himself as the bread of life. He is the real food for the hungers and thirsts of our souls. He promises that all who believe in him and come to him will never hunger or thirst.

What a great privilege we have as Catholics! At every mass, we receive the opportunity to partake of the heavenly meal to be nourished and sustained on our Christian journey.

Let us be grateful for this profound sacrament and allow this gift to transform us and nurture our relationship with the Lord. Let us pray for the grace to always trust in God's constant provision and recognize his blessings and care for us and all those in our lives.
