20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Seek God's wisdom and live by it

Our readings for this Sunday highlight the need for divine wisdom in our lives. The readings teach us to seek God's wisdom and allow this valuable gift to guide us in our daily choices and decisions.

In the first reading, the author of the book of Proverbs personifies wisdom as a strong woman who is resplendent, unfading, and available to those who seek her. The author depicts lady wisdom as a generous and gracious person. The lady wisdom has built her home and furnished it with rooms for all her guests including each of us. She has prepared a delicious banquet where rich food and fine wine are provided for all her quests to come and enjoy.

The invitation to the rich banquet is very tantalizing and open to all of us. It calls us to forsake foolishness and seek God's wisdom and understanding in our daily lives. But where can you and I find lady wisdom in our lives? Do we find this valuable gift in sacred scripture, in Christ's teaching, in the lives of the saints, in the church's social and moral teachings, and in the good example of others?

In the gospel, Jesus tells us to seek genuine nourishment in him. He declared himself as the living bread that came down from heaven. He made an incredible promise by saying that whoever eats his flesh and drinks his blood will have eternal life. This was a hard teaching for the people who followed Jesus from the time of the miracle of the multiplication of the five loaves and two fish. Jesus' statement sparked a wave of argument and disgust among the followers. Their human wisdom clouded their minds from Jesus's teaching. They asked themselves "How can this man give us his flesh to eat and blood to drink?" The people turned away from Jesus and no longer followed him.

The rejection of Jesus' teaching on his true presence in the Eucharist continues. Many of our Christian brothers and sisters still have trouble accepting and believing the true and real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Thanks to our Catholic faith and the gift of the wisdom from on high, we have stayed faithful to the teaching of Jesus on the Eucharist. We appreciate this sacred meal that God gives to us in Christ. We are here today because we want to be nourished and strengthened by God's word and the Eucharist. We come to give thanks to God for his graciousness to us in offering us every spiritual blessing from the heavens.

St. Paul cautions us in the second reading to make the most of our time and live wisely. He admonishes us to avoid immoral thoughts, bodily desires and pleasures including gluttony, sloth, drunkenness and wickedness of every kind.

God has prepared good things for us which no eye can see. As Christians, let us strive to live by God's wisdom and discern his will for us. Let us live wisely so we too can help others to escape the folly of the world and to see the beauty of embracing a life of divine wisdom. God bless.
