15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Travel lightly or simply through this early life

Have you ever over-packed or under packed for a long trip? What items did you take with you or leave home?

I must confess that I often find it hard to travel light. It happened to me the last time I went on a trip to Ghana. I over-packed and I ended up having to remove some items from my suitcase at the airport during the check-in. This experience has challenged me to learn to travel light so going through the airport security process will be smooth and stress-free for me.

On this 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, our readings teach us to rely on God's providence and not on our own resources.

In the gospel, Jesus instructed his twelve disciples to travel light. He sent them in pairs so they can support one another on their missionary journey. Jesus commissioned his disciples to proclaim the gospel, to teach people, to heal the sick and cast out unclean spirits. He wanted the disciples to be concerned about God's work hence, the command to take no food, money bag, or wallet for the journey only a walking stick.

The disciples were to rely not on their own resources but on God's provision. They were to trust in God's care through the hospitality and generosity of those they will encounter.

Jesus cautioned the twelve disciples about the rejection and hostility that will confront them but they should persevere in their good work. The disciples were to shake off the dust of their feet as a testimony against those who will not welcome them and listen to their message.

In the first reading, Amos faced rejection and hostility in his prophetic vocation. Amos was a simple farmer, a shepherd and a dresser of

vocation. Amos was a simple farmer, a shepherd and a dresser of sycamore trees in Judah. God called him to speak in his name, to denounce the evils of social injustice, corruption, and exploitation of the poor in the northern kingdom of Israel. Amos criticized the leaders of the northern kingdom of Israel including the king and Amaziah, a priest of Bethel for neglecting the needs of the poor, the weak and vulnerable people among them.

Amaziah felt threatened by the message of Amos and he tried to banish him from their territory. He told Amos to go back to his homeland of Judah, to prophesy and earn his daily bread there. Despite the hostilities, Amos continued to speak in God's name to the people.

In the second reading, Saint Paul talks about our identity in Christ. He reminds us that each of us has been blessed in Christ with every spiritual blessing and chosen to be holy and without blemish before God. All of us are called and chosen by God. We are summoned and sent forth to proclaim the gospel to the world. In this special mission, we travel together as companions of faith, holding hands together, supporting, and encouraging one another in the Lord. We learn to travel light by detaching ourselves from all the things that hinder us from focusing on the work of God's kingdom. Let us ask the Lord to enlighten the eyes of our hearts to know the hope that belongs to our call and strive each day to place ourselves at his service and one another.
