29th Sunday in Ordinary Time World Mission Sunday

This weekend we celebrate our annual World Mission Sunday. This special day brings all of us recommit ourselves to the missionary life of the church through prayer, solidarity, and sacrifice. On World Mission Sunday, we give generously to the second collection for the Society for the Propagation of Faith. We offer our prayers and generous gifts to support the work of the church in over 1,150 mission territories in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe. Through our financial contributions, we help to provide resources for the pastoral, catechetical, charitable, and evangelizing work of the church in these places. This year's Mission Sunday focuses on the theme: "Go and invite everyone to the banquet" (Mathew 22: 9). The theme reminds all of us of our common mission to bring the gospel message to every corner of the earth. In his message for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis encourages us to learn from the example of the servants who were instructed by their master to invite people to his son's wedding feast. Our Holy Father reminds us that the servants conveyed their master's message with urgency, great respect, and kindness. He urges all of us to deepen our commitment to Jesus, to take part in the celebration of the Mass and pray constantly for the church's mission of evangelization.

The scripture readings for this World Mission Sunday talk about selfless service, sacrifice, and suffering in human life. In the first reading, the book of the prophet Isaiah describes the mission of the Suffering Servant of God. In this reading, the Prophet Isaiah foresaw how God's Servant will justify many through suffering and death.

The responsorial psalm talks about the steadfast love of God. The psalmist tells us that the eyes of the Lord are upon those who fear God and hope for His kindness

In the second reading, the letter to the Hebrews speaks of Jesus as our Great High priest. The author tells us that Jesus sympathizes with us because He shares in our human nature except in sin. He says that Jesus is the source of grace and strength for all people. He pleads for each of us and invites us to embrace his way of humility and service to others.

In the gospel, Jesus gives us a lesson on sacrifice and service to one another. John and his brother James wanted positions of honor in the Lord's kingdom. Jesus taught them and all of us that true greatness or glory comes from selfless service, not from dominating or seeking power over others. He is a true example of humility and servanthood. Jesus came to serve and not be served. He laid down his life for others.

Jesus gave us a great example of humility and service to the world. As His disciples, let us all strive to follow in His footsteps by offering ourselves in love and service to one another. Filled with the spirit of the World Mission Sunday, let us go forth and invite everyone to the Lord's banquet to experience the depth of His love and mercy through our generous prayers and financial contributions. And may God grant us the grace and the material means to help to sustain the missionary life of the church. God bless,
