7th Sunday of Easter

This past Thursday, we celebrated the glorious **Feast of the Ascension of the Lord**, a moment of profound mystery and promise. Jesus did not ascend into heaven to leave us as orphans. Rather, like the disciples and His mother Mary, He invites us into a sacred time of waiting, a time to prepare our hearts with hope and expectation for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. These days between Ascension and Pentecost, form a novena of prayer. We do not wait passively, but with faith, ready to be renewed, strengthened, and clothed with the power and grace of the Spirit.

Today, we observe **World Communications Sunday**, a time to reflect on how we share the truth of the Gospel and foster unity in our families and communities. The theme for this year is "Share with gentleness, the hope that is in your hearts." In his message for this occasion, our late Holy Father, **Pope Francis**, reminded us that true communication must be rooted in compassion and clarity-free from aggression, and hostility. He urged us to reject violence and division, instead choose dialogue and peace.

The readings of this Seventh Sunday of Easter center on unity, love, and steadfast faith. The readings call us to remain faithful and forgiving, even in the face of trials and adversity.

In the Gospel, we hear Jesus' High Priestly prayer, spoken at the Last Supper. Jesus prayed to the Father for His disciples and for all believers, for protection, sanctification, unity, and growth in grace. This powerful prayer reminds us that we are never alone, but that Jesus intercedes for us, calling us into unity and holiness. His words reveal the depth of God's love and our destiny to share in His glory. Though we face struggles in this life, Jesus assures us that our faithfulness will lead to eternal joy in God's presence.

In the meantime, we are called to proclaim the truth of the Gospel and to nurture unity within our communities. As the old adage wisely declares, "United we stand, divided we fall." This enduring truth serves as a solemn reminder that our strength is found not in isolation, but in our shared commitment to one another. Indeed, the rhythms of daily life bears witness to this: where love is present, unity takes root and thrives. We are not called to sow discord or harbor resentment, but to be agents of reconciliation, extending grace and kindness in all our dealings.

In doing so, we become living answers to Christ's high priestly prayer, witnesses to the divine love that unites, sanctifies, and transforms both individuals and communities

The first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, recounts the story of Saint Stephen, a man filled with deep faith and the Holy Spirit. Chosen to serve the poor, Stephen boldly proclaimed the Gospel, even in the face of false accusations and violence. As he was being stoned, he forgave his persecutors and was granted a vision of Christ in glory. His courage and mercy mirror that of Jesus and inspire us to stand firm in our faith.

The second reading from Revelation offers a vision of hope and justice, assuring us that God's promises will be fulfilled. This vision strengthens our hope that our struggles will never be in vain.

As Pentecost draws near, let us open our hearts to the Spirit's grace and so live with courage, love with compassion, and witness with conviction. And may our lives echo Christ's prayer for unity and truth.
