3rd Sunday of Easter: The Lord accompanies us on the journey

In every step of our lives, our Christian faith assures us that we never walk our journey alone. In this Easter season, this profound truth is renewed within us: the Risen Christ accompanies us at every moment. He walks beside us-alive and present in His Word, in the breaking of the bread, and in the ordinary moments that shape our days. In Him, we receive a living hope and the enduring promise of new life.

We see this beautifully revealed in the story of the two disciples who were accompanied by the Risen Lord on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus. Though He walked and conversed with them, they did not recognize Him. The two disciples were devastated by the suffering and humiliating death of Jesus. They had hope that He would be the one to redeem Israel from oppression. Into their confusion and hopelessness, Jesus joined their conversation and opened their minds to the Scriptures, helping them to understand that everything written about the Christ had to be fulfilled.

When they reached their destination, the disciples urged the stranger who had walked with them to stay with them, for evening was near. As they sat at table, He took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them-the same actions He performed at the Last Supper and the same actions repeated at every Mass. In that moment, their eyes were opened, and they recognized the Risen Lord, though He immediately vanished from their sight. Only then did they understand that He had been with them all along, walking beside them, comforting them, and preparing them for mission. Their hearts burned within them as they recalled how He opened the Scriptures to them on the road.

The road to Emmaus is the road we all travel-through confusion, despair, and fear. Yet our faith reminds us that we never walk this path alone. The Risen Lord walks with us every step. Just as He accompanied the two disciples, He walks with us in our own moments of confusion, disappointment, and doubt, guiding us and gently leading us toward hope and new life. May this truth steady our hearts and give us courage as we continue our journey with the Lord and carry His light into the world this Easter season.
