Good Friday—Why Not Mass?

We do not celebrate Mass on this day
because it is a solemn day of prayer and
mourning, which includes fasting and
abstinence from meat. The Good Friday
service includes the Liturgy of the Word,
general intercessions, veneration of the
cross and the reception of the Eucharist,
using consecrated Hosts from the Holy
Thursday Mass. Inside the church, the altar is plain and
bare, the candle in the sanctuary lamp is out and the tab-
ernacle is empty. Jesus is not there. Listening to what
happened to Jesus in the Gospel reading on this day begs
the question, what is good about Good Friday?



“Humiliated and mocked, nailed to the cross increase the
pain, lifted high to increase the horror, dehumanized to
discredit him and undo everything for which he lived and
died, “But in this they failed. They could kill him, but
they could not eliminate him. Jesus rose victorious from
this very tomb on Easter Sunday, but that was not the day
the battle was won; the day Jesus won the battle was Fri-
day, which is why we call that Friday, ‘Good’, “Evil did
its very worst but he did his very best and his goodness
prevailed, turning the worst Friday every into the best
Friday ever.” We do not celebrate Mass on this day be-

150th Jubilee Retreat
Guest Speaker: Fr. William Garrott, O.P.
May 3rd—7th, 2025

As part of our 150th Jubilee Retreat celebration, Fr. William Garrott, O.P. from the Dominican Friar Foundation, will be having a retreat for all of the parishioners of St. Joseph and St. Vincent de Paul.

William Garrott was born November 13, 1963, in Hagerstown, Maryland. He is the youngest of eight children and has 24 nieces and nephews. After obtaining a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry and working several years in the field of technology transfer, he entered the Order of Preachers in August of 1988. After six years of spiritual and academic formation, he was ordained to the priesthood in May of 1994. Father Bill Garrott, O.P. spent four years serving as an associate pastor in Ohio where he gained experience with RCIA, adult education, Confirmation retreats, Bible studies, training and leading altar servers, lectors, and Pro-Life Marches.

Father Garrott then obtained a Masters in Theology from the University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (known as the Angelicum) in Rome. Father Garrott also served as the Director of Vocations for the Province of Saint Joseph.

Father Garrott uses his musical abilities on piano and guitar to preach parish missions, weekend retreats, days of recollection, and various youth events. He composes his own music and has release his own CD's. He was 17 years old and deeply caught up in the world of rock music when he first experienced the joy of knowing, loving and serving Jesus Christ. Through word and song, Father Garrott desires to draw listeners more deeply into that unconditional love which the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit reveal to us through the Catholic Faith.
