## RISSE – Refugee Update, April 1, 2025

RISSE is continuing to expand its network to help refugees. The new Director of Operations was the coordinator at the Federal Immigration Services in Albany for new refugees when she and others were laid off earlier by the government. So, they are "veterans" of serving refugees.

A new key task for them is to prevent newcomers to the US like these from falling into SCAMS that will take advantage of them, e.g. predatory online immigration lawyers etc. RISSE is partnering with the NYS Division of Consumer Protection and the Office for New Americans to educate everyone on this.

An Immigrant and Refugee Job Fair is planned for Apr. 23, 2025 from 12 pm to 2 pm at the Westminster Presbyterian Church, 85 Chestnut St. Albany.

Food Banks - I need to go a little deeper here. As mentioned, these are key resources for Refugees etc. An important point from my work at the NE Regional Food Bank ..... MORE PEOPLE than ever before are seeking help via the Food Bank system. In 2024 we distributed 54 million pounds of food equaling 45 million meals! But Food Banks are seeing more NEW people. And the concern is that the number of people being cut from their jobs are going to make this worse. Current cuts and "pauses" in federal programs for these resources amount to \$1 BILLION according to the Times Union (march 27,2025). This will have a trickledown effect on the Refugees who often are at the bottom of the ladder in getting their food.

The gift cards you have provided ARE a part of the solution for them. To date that has come to \$1, 930.00!!!! in cash and cards that you gave me here in church which I delivered to RISSE (signed receipts for these deliveries are on file at the rectory).
