#### THE MEANING OF THE FOUR ADVENT CANDLES

**First Candle (Hope/Prophecy Candle)**: Represents the hope and promise of the Messiah, echoing the prophecies of the Old Testament. This candle is typically purple.

**Second Candle (Peace/Bethlehem Candle):** Represents the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem and the peace of the coming of Christ. This candle is typically purple.

Third Candle (Joy/Shepherd's Candle): Represents the joy of the shepherds at the news of Jesus' birth. This is often a rose-colored candle, symbolizing the pause in penitential prayer on Gaudete Sunday.

**Fourth Candle (Love/Angel's Candle):** Represents the love of God and the angelic message of "Peace on Earth". This candle is typically purple.

#### PRAYER OF ST. MARY'S COMMUNITY

In the Albany diocese, we are at a difficult time dealing with Bankruptcy and the priest abuse scandal. We are also facing reduced parish participation and donations in a climate of demographic decline...

As individual parishes in the diocese, we have been asked by the Bishop to review and analyze parish financial information, building/repair needs, current/potential outreach programs, and clergy wellness/availability. Our parishioners on our Parish Council and a special committee formed to review and analyze our parish needs are working to help answer where we go from here.

Today, I just want to make everyone aware that looking at our parish financials shows that we have not been able to meet our parish expenses for the past 3 years. This year looks like it will be the same. Looking at all our expenses and all our income including weekly collections and donations made directly to the parish, we are short \$500 per week.

In order for our parish to survive, one of the requirements is that we must be able to sustain ourselves including a balanced budget. We have been looking at our expenses and have been taking steps to reduce expenses and control costs. We will continue to do this, but we ask for your help in meeting our financial needs.

#### Collections

For us to cover parish expenses, our weekly collection must meet \$2500 Our Collections for December 6, 7 & 8, 2025 \$4990

## IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update December 13 –14, 2025

\*I delivered a full truck this past week of all the winter gear we had in our Choir Loft AND a load of personal/health materials that Father John brought me from Immaculate Conception on Sunday. They are much appreciated as we are certainly now in winter.

As we were loading those on the dock, a young black woman who had called earlier, drove up with 4 bags of kids' clothes and two bags of toys. She was so glad to donate and quietly acknowledged the gratitude behind the need. It caused us to pause and think about how perhaps the needs may be recognized more by those who may have HAD needs in their own lives.

\*Mohammad, (our liaison with Senator Schumer's office on the Ukrainians), reviewed USCRI plan to try and set up PRE PLANNED personal goods and foods "totes" for their clients. Given that the number in family and the job situation is known, totes could be filled ahead of time for pickup on a schedule, to avoid the time it would take for a family representative to come to the pantry, pick out the goods, possibly with having to bring children along. Not that children are not welcome, but more the case of having one's hands full. He cited the case of one family of ten where the father is working but a larger than normal allotment would be needed above and beyond supplies from other sources. And sadly, it also means one less risk in being on the street at this time of indiscriminate stops by ICE.

\*I also met Claire who is an **ESL** (English as a **S**econd **L**anguage) staffer there. They are set to start their next ESL class after the New Year. Interesting conversation among us on fact that she had contacted Senator Gellibrand's office earlier in YEAR and just now finally got a response. OF COURSE, IT WAS A PRO FORMA LETTER, thanks for contacting me etc. with no direct answer on her concern.

#### **QUESTIONS AND THOUGHTS**

- We need a better way here ....... perhaps a few more calls, etc. that make it **CLEAR** that we don't have time to wait for months for answers on this issue.
- Perhaps some publicity on how our elected officials DON'T respond.
- I do understand they are busy-----but----so are we!!

\*The Afghan from Rensselaer who had to report to ICE at Malta on Monday. This is a perfect example of bureaucracy at its worst, probably thanks to DOGE, where ALL papers, filings, applications are so backed up that any further requests for clarification also gets no response. Which then leads to changes in deadlines or cancelations of automatic extensions for working papers not getting through (as of Oct. 30th, automatic extensions have been stopped!!). Fortunately, he had ALL his paper in order, they realized their particular situation being Afghan and an attorney was involved.

\*Lastly do you know who the "Shadow President" is? And his stance on Immigration? you might want to check that out. After all its about **YOUR** children's and grandchildren's futures.

\*Lastly, yes, I will take any donations through the holidays. In new year we will know more about the Pre-Package plan mentioned above.
