RISSE – Refugee Update

RISSE is still collecting gift cards for refugees. To donate, you can use same process we have been using. Please see the flyer on RISSE that is in the Pews.

Things we know:

- Volunteers at the USCRI <u>https://refugees.org/uscri-albany/</u> (where staff were cut) have indicated that they have a dedicated Amazon page for donating directly. However, with our existing system above I would suggest we adhere to that at this time.
- USCRI **HAS a WAITING LIST** for strollers in good condition. This would indicate that there are a significant number of families who have arrived here with that need. **IF** you have strollers **BRING to CHURCH** and Ken Scallon will collect and deliver them.
- Catholic Charities does amazing work for many in need. They do not interface directly with RISSE, USCRI etc. BUT it is important to understand the extensive outreach they are doing and refugees/immigrants by virtue of their needs are equally welcome and in fact may already be served as that category is not a determinant for BEING served (please note their article in recent Evangelist). I now have a connection there with whom I have discussed this issue.
- All refugees /immigrants ARE directed to local food banks, Catholic Charities has a number of those and many churches, others, have their own.
- This is what we know to date. It is sometimes not easy to find out details given the concerns about sharing of information /resources.
