Remade for Mission

St. Mary's Church has started the process for Remade for Mission. This is a 6-month process that will culminate with final consolidated recommendations being sent to the Bishop by April 1st, 2026.

We have a work group of 7 individuals who will meet twice a month to review topics provided by the Bishop and the Vicar, Fr. Brian Kelly. The intent is to align our recommendations with the Catholic Mission, parish sustainability and outreach effectiveness.

As we move forward, there will be 4 synods that will be presented to our Parrish by Mary Ann Roberts and members of our work group. It is very important that we have parishioners' feedback.

I am asking each and every one of you to pray for discernment and allow the Holy Spirit to guide us through this process.

IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update November 1 – 2, 2025

**First and foremost, I want to emphasize here our REMADE FOR MISSION process as mentioned by Mary Ann earlier. We now start that in order to complete our part by April 2026. While it is in a way a separate task, it ties into what we want St. Mary's Community to be going forward. I believe that what we have seen these past 9 months with the Refugees is one example of that "mission". I am hopeful that we will be able to integrate that into our final report as one example of who we are and St. Mary's dedication to all who are in need.

IMMIGRATION - Refugee Update Cont....

- **By the time you read this we will know where the SNAP program stands as November 1 was the slated shutdown unless an "adjustment /allowance" was done by the US Agriculture Dept.to keep it available to those in need. This of course includes refugees, immigrants as well as all in our society in need during these dire times. Given my volunteering at the Regional Food Bank I am certainly aware of this issue from the supply end.
- **After reviewing the Ukrainians Privacy Releases which will allow Senator Schumer's office to seek their original applications so they can get them renewed and hopefully get their jobs back or seek new ones, we now have 8 individuals, 2 couples, and 1 family who have filed to date for that to proceed. The "Ukrainian Team" at USCRI is pursuing anyone else affected.
- **I have dropped the first load of "winter" goods at USCRI. They have cleared storage for some of those. I will continue on that task. This load was 8 various size "bags, etc.". Also delivered was laundry soaps, rice, etc.
- **I realize that it's hard to keep those "daily needs" in mind from the lists in our pews. Especially now with the potential SNAP situation and even your own needs. Curiously I now have become one of those people who is always asking for help. But that is the way it is now, it seems, in America.
