IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update November 8 – 9, 2025

- **Again, a reminder that we are approaching our **REMADE FOR MISSION** process. **Please** be ready to follow this process that our Committee will be working on for us.
- **As I write this early in week we are still in dire straits with the SNAP Program even though a \$\$ solution exists to some degree --and hopefully will have been reached by now. I would emphasize here again that our REFUGEES are certainly not immune to this as those that have had access to SNAP will lose those benefits along with other Americans.
- **Our Ukrainians. Two more individuals have been identified and signed off on their Privacy Releases for Senator Schumer's Staff to trace their working papers that were cut off. To date we don't have any confirmation that they have been located and renewed etc. in the meantime the US Committee for Refugees and Immigrants, (our link in this), will continue to support their food needs etc. as much as possible. I was asked earlier if these people could work privately for a person e.g. lawn work, house work, etc. The only answer at this point I can give is that type of working relationship could risk their status. (Such as that is now !! pretty absurd!).

***TYPES OF REFUGEE STATUS:

Just informationally, there are a number of these and it can be confusing. Here are TWO that we are currently involved with. I will list more of these in future bulletins in hopes that we can all better understand this.

- 1. **SIV** ---Special Immigrant Visa holder--- These are people granted this due to their service to the U S. Govt. (think Afghans who worked with our military OR AID groups, govt agencies). They are typically considered a Lawful Permanent Resident upon admission.
- 2. **TPS** Temporary Protected Status holder -- For nationals of designated countries unable to return safely. Protected from removal while TPS is active BUT Must apply. It is not automatically granted. (Our Ukrainians!).
- ** Again, any donations are welcome e.g. Rice, Laundry Soap, Shampoo, etc. I will continue to deliver, along with another load of Winter once I get clearance. AND A BIG THANKS to our cash donations---I bought another SEWING MACHINE this; past week!!
