IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update October 4 – 5, 2025

- * We don't have any new info on the Ukrainians, renewal or? of their permits. Unfortunately, this may take time. That, without jobs, they don't have. Especially since a NEW permit costs \$550.00. And a renewal costs \$275.00! (You can see by this that the Administration is not LOSING money here.
- * Here is another example of how this is actually somewhat complicated. Last week I gave you the info on EADs, (Employment Authorization Documents). As it turned out I actually had cited the wrong number from the web site! How stupid of me? An actual application (with your fee) is actually an I 765! The ACTUAL card that you would have issued to you (don't forget your photo for that card when you apply!!) is an I 766. NOW you can go ahead and apply by downloading the correct document. Sorry for the Black Humor here....... but as we said before, this is fraught with challenges and USCRI and RISSE are vital to be able to help these refugees through this process, so they can be productive citizens here.
- * We will deliver our last load of Bikes on Tuesday thanks to Tom Bolani. This wraps up bikes for the season. SEWING MACHINES ------ if anyone has any leads let us know. Last count they still have 8 refugees on the wait list. Perhaps once we get that last double stroller ordered (imagine 3 moms expecting twins!!), we can shift any \$\$ we get to buying sewing machines.
- * Thanks so far to those stockpiling health and personal goods in back. I will soon be delivering those. And bedding, blankets, coats, etc. all can be stockpiled in the Choir Loft.



IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update Cont.

- *SNAP--- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program- Follow this in the news. It does not sound good. Here's some basic #'s from the Jesuit magazine, AMERICA, Sept. 2025.
- 1. \$186 billion is amount likely to be cut from SNAP through 2034 -- the largest reduction in the programs history.
- 2. 22.3 million Number of U.S. families who will lose some or all of their benefits.
- 3. 24% --- The increase in food prices between 2020- 2024. Food prices increased 2.9% between May 2024 and May 2025. Rising food prices have outstripped economy-wide inflation.

Please think about where our refugees AND our lower income families are in all of this!!!
