Remade for Mission

St. Mary's Church has started the process for Remade for Mission. This is a 6-month process that will culminate with final consolidated recommendations being sent to the Bishop by April 1st, 2026.

We have a work group of 7 individuals who will meet twice a month to review topics provided by the Bishop and the Vicar, Fr. Brian Kelly. The intent is to align our recommendations with the Catholic Mission, parish sustainability and outreach effectiveness.

As we move forward, there will be 4 synods that will be presented to our Parrish by Mary Ann Roberts and members of our work group. It is very important that we have parishioners' feedback.

IMMIGRATION – Refugee Update October 25 – 26, 2025

I had an extensive meeting with Shannon last week on wide range of issues and we are continuing to follow some of those. Overall, it's not encouraging in the long run. As I have indicated before, this Administration seems determined to shut down immigration for most people. There may be an attempt to CHARGE additional fees to some who are already here beyond the usual application fees etc. Apparently much of this is buried in the "BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL".!!

- * WE ARE IN A HOLD STATUS on calling legislators regarding the Ukrainians. Senator Schumer et.al., are trying to untangle their status as it now is evident that there are TWO categories by which they were allowed into America. One is Temporary Protected Status, the other is Parolee Status. (the latter has NOTHING to do with what that term usually means! They are not criminals, etc.) It appears that if the wrong category is designated then that may affect their job status etc. At this point literally 7 have lost their jobs, the others are in a limbo situation and I am waiting for more info.
- **** YOU CAN MAKE THIS CALL! To Senator Schumer's office and THANK THEM for helping the Ukrainian Refugees with their job status! Remember they need a complement when they do the right thing.!
- * OUR PRIORITIES ------MORE THAN EVER ESPECIALLY WITH THE Ukrainian situation, Laundry Soap, (NOTE: SOAP BARS, ZOTE Brand as many do their laundry in the tub to save money as Laundromat is expensive), Diapers, (large), Shampoo, AND RICE in larger sacks, e.g. the 15 or 20 lb. bags. EVERYONE uses rice as a basis for many food dishes.
- * I delivered the last double stroller needed! AND another sewing machine!! But guess what, every time a sewing machine comes in others are needed. Current count is 12 needed. I will buy those out of any \$\$ we get.
- *After initial communication, Immaculate Conception will be JOINING US on this mission! I and Father are setting that up now with them. We are very pleased to have them help., Would that more churches would step up but I have to understand that everyone is under stress here.

Which is why I know you must wonder when this is going to ease up or?? Well, read the news. and I think you have the answer.

IMMIGRATION - Refugee Update Cont.'...

- *Interesting conversation with my friend who is in the Carpenters Union (management), this past week. In discussing employment, he asked if I knew who to talk to in Buffalo to find immigrants that might be able to work. THEY ARE DESPERATE FOR SHEET ROCK WORKERS AT THE NEW BUFFALO BILLS STADIUM AND CANNOT GET HELP! I steered him to two Refugee sources out there but they have probably already been there seeking workers. So, a note to keep in mind when you hear someone say that immigrants take our jobs, you can tell them they are misinformed. There are jobs --but not enough "Americans" want them!
- * One positive USCRI annual figure for job starts is 118 placements (out of their 450 families), at an average rate of 17,20 an hour. And we helped make that possible with our support.
