PRAYER OF ST. MARY'S COMMUNITY

In the Albany diocese, we are at a difficult time dealing with Bankruptcy and the priest abuse scandal. We are also facing reduced parish participation and donations in a climate of demographic decline...

As individual parishes in the diocese, we have been asked by the Bishop to review and analyze parish financial information, building/repair needs, current/potential outreach programs, and clergy wellness/availability. Our parishioners on our Parish Council and a special committee formed to review and analyze our parish needs are working to help answer [where we go from here](#).

Today, I just want to make everyone aware that looking at our parish financials shows that we have not been able to meet our parish expenses for the past 3 years. This year looks like it will be the same. Looking at all our expenses and all our income including weekly collections and donations made directly to the parish, we are short \$500 per week.

In order for our parish to survive, one of the requirements is that we must be able to sustain ourselves including a balanced budget. We have been looking at our expenses and have been taking steps to reduce expenses and control costs. We will continue to do this, but we ask for your help in meeting our financial needs.

In Our Community

IMMIGRATION – Refugee Report January 10 – 11, 2026

I delivered @ 20 bags of clothing etc. last week. AT THIS POINT THEY SAID WE CAN HOLD OFF ON THOSE KIND OF MATERIALS as they will move them onto their shelves and inventory to determine what is still needed.

At this point though it does appear that FOOTWARE for winter is still a need. But I will know more after I meet with Shannon, Sara. That will then help us determine more exactly how to fill that need. Most likely this could involve hunting the Thrift Stores and selecting sizes.

Refugee paperwork etc.--From what I was just told, much of that paperwork was being handled through the State Dept., BUT NOW IS BEING TRANSFERRED TO HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES. Why this is being done we don't know. Our concern is that this will only complicate any paperwork being done on timeAnd as we know with the Ukrainians none of their renewals are done. I hope to know more this coming week.

The Cabrini Pledge- you will remember that we all got handouts on this in church in November urging us to sign to support immigrants, refugees etc. HOPEFULLY some of you did go online and sign this. It was instituted by the US Bishops and our own was distributed by the NYS Bishops.

I wanted to find out how many signed to date and how these numbers were to be used as they would illustrate support for this issue. I ATTEMPTED to contact the US Bishops via their web site and after filling out the necessary request and submitting it, a pop up asked me to "TRY AND CONTACT THEM AGAIN LATER". I then contacted the NYS Bishops via their web site-----and have heard NOTHING!

Let me be blunt here--- If this is how the USCBB is going to respond on this issue then we may as well consider the whole issue ENDED!

IMMIGRATION – Refugee Report Cont.....

I read and hear how our church cares so much, etc. and it's clear that there are a handful of Bishops who are truly opposing the Administration's policies. BUT, there appears to be a real lack of action on the part of the USCCB overall to face the administration and demand action. I will continue to watch this as its crucial to the very population that WE ARE HELPING!

Hopefully better news in the coming week after my meeting at USCRI.....
