The 2025 Holy/Jubilee Year: 2024 - A YEAR OF PRAYER for the 2025 JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

Pope Francis has declared a Jubilee Year of Hope in 2025. He has also announced a year of prayer in preparation for the Jubilee. The Holy Father announced its launch on 21st January 2024, the fifth annual celebration of the 'Sunday of the Word of God'. Earlier, the Pope had written: "From now on I am happy to think that the year preceding the Jubilee event, 2024, will be dedicated to a great 'symphony' of prayer so as to rediscover the desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and adore him." For a complete text of the Papal Bull https://www.iubilaeum2025.va/en/giubileo-2025/bolla.html Several aspects of the Bull refer to liturgy and are well worth noting — Mass preparations; baptismal fonts; indulgences; the Common Date of Easter (the East and West will celebrate on the same date in 2025); reconciliation and missionaries of mercy; and more. It does not appear that local dioceses should formally have a "Holy Door," but the Bull does encourage local pilgrimages to cathedrals and other sacred places.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 15, 2024 - Third Sunday of Advent

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him, "What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?" The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices, being content with their wages. It's so undramatic. But how many actually did it? We don't know. How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives? That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation. Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming." Then make the appropriate changes.

Sometimes, however, in this busy world, it can be challenging to figure out ways to slow down and focus on the beauty of Advent amid the rush of the secular version of the Christmas season. There are so many fun and beautiful ways to celebrate the weeks leading up to Christmas. Why not try something new this Advent and start a tradition of your own?

Favorite Advent Traditions

Read about St. Nicholas and leave small gifts in your children's shoes on his Feast Day on Dec. 6

Celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on

Dec. 9 by baking spice cookies

Whip up a batch of Mexican Hot Chocolate to celebrate the <u>Our Lady of Guadalupe on Dec. 12</u>. Enjoy it as you read A Prayer to our Lady of Guadalupe with your family.

<u>Learn about the legend of St. Lucy</u> and bake a special batch of Santa Lucia buns and take a drive to see all the Christmas lights

Take tree trimming back to its roots. The Christmas tree wasn't always decorated with glass bulbs and string lights, but with apples, nuts and Marzipan cookies. You can bake cookies and string popcorn and cranberries with your loved ones to hang on the tree. This is especially handy if you are a new homeowner or recently out on your own and don't have a collection of ornaments yet.

<u>Create an Advent Jesse Tree</u>. This ancient tradition, based on Isaiah 11:1, helps children learn the Christmas story and related Scripture. Search the internet for background information, instructions, and required materials.

Set up a small manger in a prominent place in your home, and invite the kids to place a piece of 'hay' in it for every act of kindness or sacrifice they make to prepare a soft bed for the Christ Child

<u>Listen to an Advent playlist</u> rather than Christmas carols

Advent Wreaths & Calendars - Advent wreaths made of evergreen branches represent God's endless love and Eternal Life. The wreath is outfitted with four candles, three purple and one rose meant to represent hope, love, joy and Peace. Place an Advent wreath on your table and light the candles every time you sit down to eat. If you have kids, you can make your own wreath as a family craft. And don't forget to bless the wreath.

Take it a step further and forage for Advent wreath decorations. You can collect branches, dry flowers, citrus fruits and berries, and snip evergreen branches and holly berries to decorate your wreath. On the first Sunday start with the plain pine branches and slowly add more and more decorations each week, by Christmas, you will have a beautifully decorated wreath. After adding the decorations, bless and light the wreath.

<u>Use an Advent Calendar to count down the days till</u>
<u>Christmas</u> – have everyone share one thing they are grateful for before opening each door or practice works of mercy on the journey towards Christmas. You can even download a calendar to print!


