GOSPEL MEDITATION -

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE May 4, 2025 - Third Sunday of Easter John 21: 1-19

I eat breakfast. If I don't have something substantial, I'm fading by midmorning. Breakfast is my key meal because it sets up my physical wellbeing for the rest of the day.

Spiritually speaking, we need sustenance to get us going. This is true for the Apostles in this Sunday's remarkable Gospel reading. The risen Jesus makes his third appearance to them in the early morning light and calls, "Come, have breakfast" (John 21:12). The exhausted and cold fishermen sit, and he feeds them bread and fish as the dawn breaks. They are overwhelmed by his presence to the point of awestruck silence. As they eat, their bodies and their hearts come alive. Once refreshed by their morning meal, they will be ready to feed others — indeed, the whole world — with the love of the risen Jesus. But first, they need breakfast from him.

Do you realize how essential early morning prayer is? Jesus desires to refresh us every morning with his word of love, with his grace-filled presence. This week, hear Jesus calling to you: "Come, have breakfast!" Embrace some form of spiritual, meditative practice each morning for spiritual strength to get you going.

Saint Cecilia Parish Meeting April 25, 2025

Kathy Marcais, St. Cecilia's Pastoral Council president, opened the meeting with a reflection on "Community" by Father James Walsh of the Albany Diocese. Father answered the question "Why do we need to go to Mass".

The purpose of this meeting was to summarize the information that was presented in a meeting for Montgomery County parish leaders regarding the Diocese concerns about the viability of our churches; Pastoral Council discussions; the April 3, 2025 Evangelist article.

This area has 7 parishes, more than needed to serve the number of Catholics in the county. Most of the parishes are within a few miles of each other.

There is a shortage of priests which will not change in the near future. This year the Diocese has 49 active priests to serve 126 parishes.

Parish properties are very old and are costly to repair and maintain.

The Pastoral Council has been discussing the following issues:

Weekly attendance at Mass is low as well as participation in parish activities/committees.

We barely meet our financial obligations. Ann Mahon, Finance Committee, said we are paying our bills but are dipping into savings in order to do so. Maintenance and repairs could not happen without a few who volunteer time and money.

We need to solidify and support our Faith Formation Program and catechists.

We don't know how committed parishioners are to this parish

Kathy asked the attendees (25) the following questions:

Why do you attend Mass here at St. Cecilia's?

Feels like home; our community; safe, peaceful; family history; need to be fed weekly; welcoming people; kids' friends are also in Faith Formation; we help one another (e.g. rides to doctors and give support through difficult times); Christian Service volunteers.

What prevents you or someone you know from attending Mass every week?

They don't feel it is important anymore; sports, travel teams on weekends; accessibility of church building; some do not believe in the Real Presence; C and E Catholics (Christmas and Easter); Kids think that confirmation is an ending not the beginning; our culture/society does not value religion; parents are not making it a priority; able to watch on TV.

How do you determine how much money to put in the collection basket?

10% of annual income divided by 12 equals monthly donation; 401k disbursement contributions reduce gross income and reduces taxes; church absences/vacations/shrine attendance reduce collections because many do not "make them up"; fundraisers help but are not bringing in large amounts.

What is the purpose or mission of our parish?

Have access to the Mass and sacraments; pass our faith on to our children; be a community of believers; help each other to practice our faith and make it visible. Show the differences between city and rural communities.

How can we help our parishioners, neighbors, schools, and community?

Direct homily to kids especially when they are assisting at Mass; we are unique and should not be compared to other parishes; bring the Eucharist to shut-ins; perhaps forming a Parents group to organize activities around church (family fun activities; help with church clean-up, planning liturgy); concerns expressed about those who no longer attend church.

Next meeting date has not been set but it has been suggested that we have it at a Parish breakfast or potluck meal.


