This project is something that myself, Fr. Pat and a small committee have been working on securing for over a year and we are so excited to see our efforts come to fruition this summer with a ground breaking date of in late August. The construction of a security vestibule at the front entrance to our building. GOSPEL REFLECTION

he readings this week tell us how God provides us food for our journey back to him and how Jesus is the true

food from heaven that gives us life and leads us to eternal life. Now as I was thinking about that theme, I began to think about how I am sustained and renewed each week to continue my own faith journey. I decided that the way I spend my Sundays, contributes greatly to my ability to lead life faithfully without getting discouraged and off track.

On Sundays I get recharged in a couple of different ways, first and foremost through the Mass, where my Spirit is fed and I get reconnected with Christ and renewed for another week. Then, in the afternoon, I get some downtime with my favorite sport and that gives me the rest and relaxation I need. The sport I enjoy the most is watching is Nascar. Now the more I thought about it, the more I began to connect what the Mass does for me, with what the pit crew does for the car and driver in a Nascar race, and I thought it would be a pretty good illustration for the theme this week.

Now you might ask, "How could the Mass be anything like a Nascar race?" but let me explain. In a Nascar race, the skills of the pit crew and the driver are both important to not only do well in the race but even for the driver to finish at all. While some folks think that not much skill should be required to do nothing but constantly turn the car left, when they do that at 200 miles per hour, it is like when you and I have to make a turn on an icy road. It takes a great deal of driving skill and fine tuning of the car to keep the race car from sliding off the track. So, every time they have to make a pit stop, the crew has to tune the balance of the car with tiny little changes to make that car stick to the track better. And then they have to fill up the car with as much fuel as they can. If they don't get the tuning right or they don't get it absolutely full of fuel, then there is a good chance the car will slide off the corner and into the wall or will run out of fuel while trying to stretch to the end of the race.

Even though the pit stop is crucially important, they try to rush it and limit the time to as few seconds as possible. So, they often don't get enough tuning or fuel, and many cars fall way behind or never finish the race. Now, how does all this relate to us and the Mass? Well, I think that we often find ourselves racing through life and it can be an endless struggle for us to try to keep up, let alone get ahead. And sometimes we can come into one of the many turns of our lives going a bit too fast or with our faith slightly out of tune.

So, the very same thing can happen to us, we can start to slide off track. This constant struggle to keep up and stay on track can be a constant drain on our faith. So, we too need to stop, we need to come in to Mass and hear the gospel over and over and we need to spend some time in prayer with God so that our faith gets the fine tuning we need. That tuning builds up our faith and gives us the strength and grip to stay on track. More importantly, we need to receive the bread of life, the Eucharist, to stay in communion with Christ and in communion with each other.

It is this communion that sustains life within us and keeps us moving toward Heaven. If we try to go too long without coming to Mass, then we can be in danger of sliding completely off track and our faith can hit a wall; or we can run completely out of fuel and find ourselves dead in our faith. Then we can have a very hard time to come back. If we make the same mistake that often happens in Nascar, and we try to rush or limit the time that we spend in prayer and attending Mass, then we are in danger of not letting Christ give us everything we need to finish the race. If we get so preoccupied with getting back out there in the race that we are never really are present to the Lord at Mass, then we run the same risk of coming up short to finish the race.

So, this Sunday, as we come to receive "the bread of life" let it be our prayer that we will be attentive to the Lord so that He may fill us with everything we need to reach the goal of our faith.
