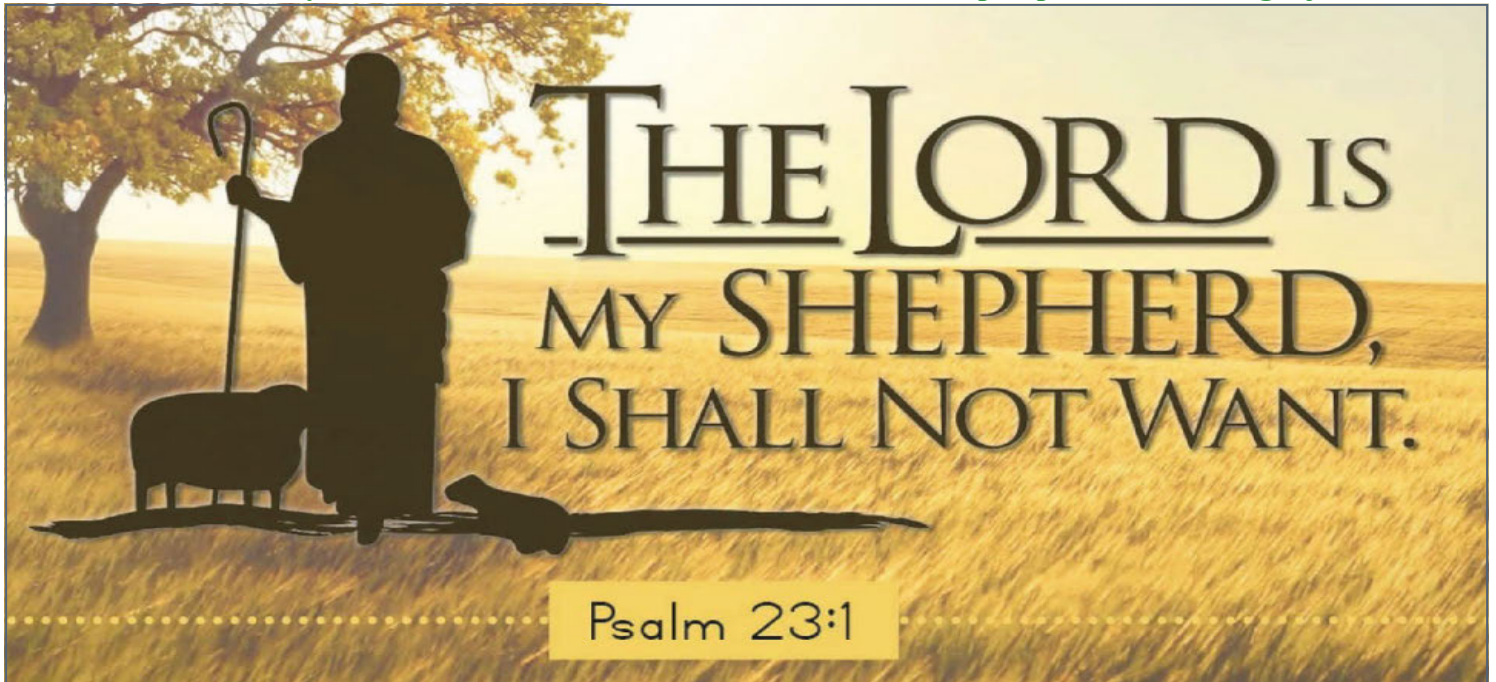

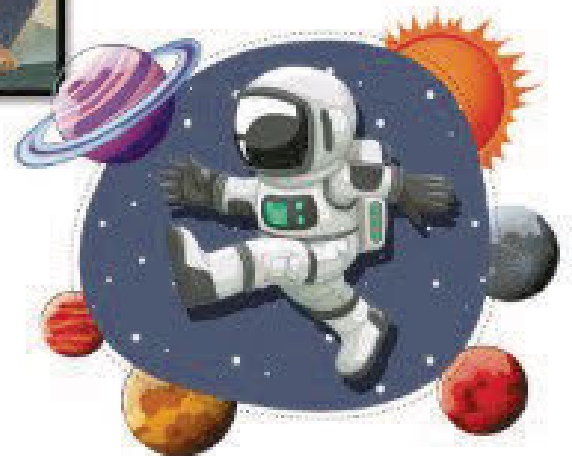
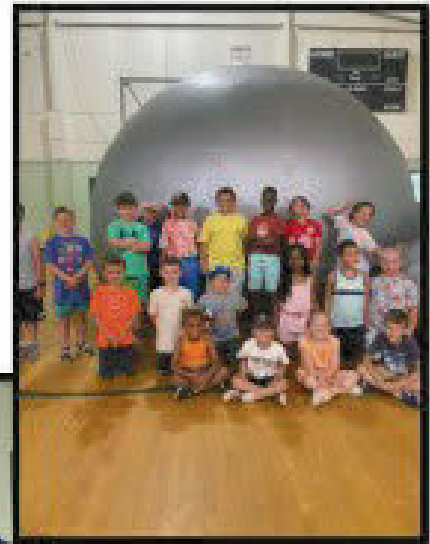

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Gospel this week has two points that I would like to reflect on today. The first point is that the kingdom of God is already here and all of us are already members by virtue of our baptism. The Church is the realization of the Kingdom of God on earth and all of us are the Church. At our baptism we become children of God and we come to share in the mission of Jesus Christ. Today's Gospel portrays the mission that Jesus intends his followers to take up. To "go out and preach repentance for the Kingdom of God is near". That call for repentance is a call for people to turn and believe in the Son of God. Later on, Jesus will send his disciples out to baptize all people, "in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit."

Yet, Jesus does not send us out on this mission alone. He sent them out two by two. Likewise, we will always have the support of church in this mission and never be alone on our witness. Christ, from the beginning has provided a cloud of witnesses.

The Gospel today also has a note of urgency in this mission to go and make disciples. They were not to dawdle where there preaching is not accepted but to shake the dust off their sandals and move on quickly. There were to take no supplies but to trust in Christ's providence. So, what does all this say to us today? We all have a share in the ongoing mission of the Church to go and make disciples. Our call may be every bit as urgent today as it was in the early Church because we have a large portion of a whole generation that has either left the Church or has never been part of the church.

The numbers of people we need to reach continues to grow rapidly in the next generation. We are called to reach out to them with love, offering compassion and healing in the same way Christ modeled for us. We may be already fulfilling this mission in our participation with our Church. We only need to remind ourselves that we reflect Christ in our service so we should keep that in always in mind.

In closing today, I will leave you with this quote from Cardinal Franz Konig, former archbishop of Vienna, who was one of the leading bishops of the Second Vatican Council. He said, "The Church of Christ must be an inviting church, a church with open doors, a warming, motherly church for all generations, a church of the dead, the living and the unborn, a church of those before us, those with us and those after us, a church of understanding and sympathy, sharing our joy and our sorrow, a church that laughs with the people and cries with the people, a church that is not foreign and does not act that way, a human church, a church for us, a church that, like a mother, can wait for her children, a church that looks for her children and follows them, a church that visits the children where they are, at work or at play, at the factory gate and at the football stadium, and within the four walls of the home, a church of those in the shadow, of those who weep, of those who grieve, a church of the worthy, but also the unworthy, of the saints and the sinners, a church not of pious pronouncements, but of silent helping action." So, as we come to share at the Lord's table this week, let it be our prayer that we will strive to be that inviting church.
