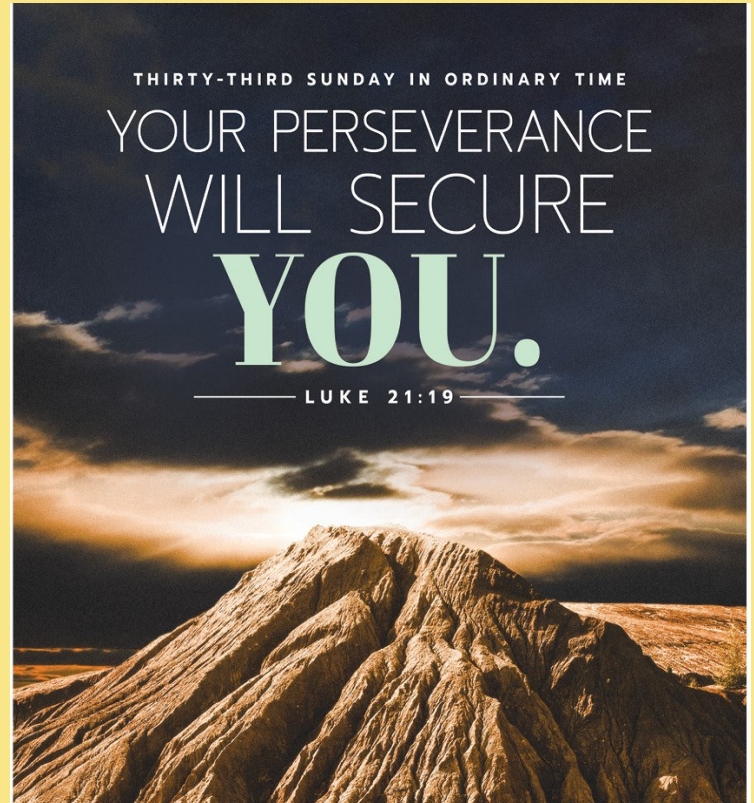

Take a moment to reflect on what's been helping you draw closer to God—then share with friends, fellow parishioners, and one another so we can grow together in faith.

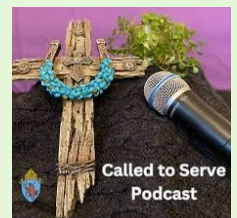
