ADVENT BANNER

Our Advent Banner adorning the wall behind the Altar has the symbols of the Jesse Tree, the “family tree” portraying the spiritual heritage of Jesus. This “family tree” comes from the prophecy of Isaiah 11:1-2, “There shall come forth from the stump of Jesse a shoot.”

Traditionally, symbols of the family of Jesus from Adam and Eve to Joseph and Mary are hung on the tree while the story of that person is shared with the family. The stories can be found in Genesis, 1 Samuel and 2 Samuel in the Old Testament and in Luke in the New Testament.

Harp and Star: The six-pointed star is the emblem of the Royal House of David even to this day. Christ who is born of the House of David, from whose line the Messiah can be born, can truly claim this emblem as His own. The harp is a symbol for David. “A servant spoke up to say: ‘I have observed that one of the sons of Jesse of Bethlehem is a skillful harpist’.” (1 Sam 16:1:23)

Lily: Mary, you will conceive and bear a son. “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.” (Luke 1:26-38)

Ark: God will save humanity from sin and death. Noah preserved the natural life of all within the Ark; Christ brings supernatural life to mankind and preserves that life within His Mystical Body the Church.

This year, Christmas Day and the Fourth Sunday of Advent are both days of precept and they both have the same rank in the Table of Liturgical Days.

Therefore, we have two obligations to fulfill – we must go to two distinct Masses.

The fulfillment of the Mass obligation does not depend upon the Mass prayers and readings but rather on the time of day at which one attends Mass. According to canon 1248 §1, “A person who assists at a Mass celebrated anywhere in a Catholic rite either on the feast day itself or in the evening of the preceding day satisfies the obligation of participating in the Mass.”

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Why do Catholics give the sign of peace to one another at Mass?

Inspired by the Jesus' words to his first followers, we stand together in a spirit of communion to pray as Jesus taught us: “Our Father who art in heaven...” The rite of peace follows. As the celebrant prays that Christ's peace will fill our hearts, our communities, the Church, & the whole world, we extend to those around us a sign of peace (usually a hug or a handshake) as a symbol of the communion that we experience now & will experience forever in the fullness of the reign of God. We are also reminded of Jesus' teachings that if we are at prayer & remember that a brother or sister is holding something against us, then we are to go & seek reconciliation with them before we continue our prayer (see Matthew 5:23). And so, the sign of peace also reminds us of the need to truly be in communion — united in love & peace — with God & one another before we approach the altar to receive the Eucharist. So, the next time you're at Mass & the time comes for the sign of peace, remember that this is a moment to celebrate the gift of Christ's peace that each of us has received from God & to pass that peace along to those around us. We need this moment to practice, because this is also the same peace of Christ that we are instructed to carry out into the world at the end of Mass when the priest or deacon says to us, “Go, in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” ©LPI
