



STATIONS OF THE CROSS—A LENTEN **TRADITION**

The Stations of the Cross are a Lenten Tradition that dates back to the early Christian Church which follow the walk of Jesus' Passion and Death. Each Friday evening at 7 pm (except March 28th), the Stations of the Cross will be presented in a different format designed to bring us closer to the Lord and help us to recognize His great love for us. Starting on March 7th, the Bereavement Team will present the traditional Stations of the Cross by St. Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of the Redemptorists. Written in the 1700's, these stations are still popular today. Watch the bulletin each week for the theme of the upcoming Stations of the Cross.

SAINT JOSEPH'S TABLE

Saint Joseph is one of the most beloved saints among Italian-Americans. As the patron of workers and the protector of the family, he is honored with a feast on March 19. According to legend, there was a famine in Sicily many centuries ago. The villagers prayed to St. Joseph, foster-father of the Infant Savior, and asked his intercession before the throne of God. Their prayers were answered. With the ending of the dreadful famine, a special feast of thanksgiving was held in commemoration of the Saint. This celebration became tradition. Wealthy families prepared huge buffets. They then invited the less fortunate people of the village, especially the homeless and sick. Here at Christ the King this year, in keeping with this tradition, we ask each parishioner to bring a food item and place it on the tables in the Gathering Space the weekend of March 15-16t. All the food collected will be blessed after the 11 am Mass on March 16 and then will be distributed to the Guilderland Food Pantry and to Saint John's/St. Anne's Food Pantry. This is a wonderful way for us (children too) to give Alms to those in need during this Lenten Season. Let's fill the Gathering Space with food!
