YOUR LARGER STORY

Albert Einstein once wrote: "A human being is a part of a whole, something called by us a universe, a part limited in time and space. He experiences himself, his thoughts and feelings, as something separated from the rest, [which is] a kind of optical delusion of his consciousness. This delusion is a kind of prison for us, restricting us to our personal desires and to affection for a few persons nearest to us. This is nothing more than the golden rule: doing unto others as we would have them do unto us, a moral principle known in every single religion on earth.
