Lent in Our Parish

Our worship space is simple, stark, and prayerful. Purples remind us of the call to conversion. Willow branches help us to look forward to spring. The waters of our Baptismal Font are stilled until Easter. The Cross centers us on our mission. We gather together singing of our companionship on our faith journey; because God is so in love with us we come home as family to be nourished. We acknowledge the sin and need for healing among us and our whole world. We sing in the ancient Greek "Kyrie, Christe eleison" as we have for countless centuries, trusting in the abundance of God's mercy for all. Our response to the

Hebrew Scriptures is Psalm 103: "As vast as heaven, deep as the ocean, so strong Your love for all who follow on Your way." We approach the Gospel in stillness and awe as we hear God's story, God's Word living among us. The Lord invites us to gather around the Table to be uplifted by Christ's real presence as food for our journey. We sing of our mystery:

"We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again."

We are empowered to embrace the Cross as a community of life. Our Eucharistic prayer engages us to be the sacrament of Christ in our World. We sing: "We are God's People, beloved in Christ." The Great Amen culminates our prayer of thanksgiving. After Communion, in the heart of our community, we hear God speak tenderly, gently to each one of us, "I have loved you with an everlasting love, I have called you and you are mine." We respond wholeheartedly with renewed faith to go forth as a pilgrim people abounding in peace, compassion, and love for our world!

Lenten Psalm of Awakening

Come, O Life-giving Creator, and rattle the door latch of my slumbering heart. Awaken me as you breathe upon a winter-wrapped earth, gently calling to life virgin Spring. Awaken in these fortified days of Lenten prayer and discipline my youthful dream of holiness. Call me forth from the prison camp of my numerous past defeats and my narrow patters of being to make my ordinary life extra-ordinarily alive, through the passion of my love. Show to me during these Lenten days how to take the daily things of life and by submerging them in the sacred, to infuse them with a great love for you, O God, and for others. Guide me to perform simple acts of love and prayer, the real works of reform and renewal of this overture to the spring of the Spirit. O Father of Jesus, Mother of Christ, help me not to waste these precious Lenten days of my soul's spiritual springtime.
