

Bankruptcy/Lawsuits Update

New York State Courts have appointed two mediators—Paul Van Osselaer and Roger Kramer. They will negotiate between the survivors/lawyers and the Diocese. Each parish pays \$1,000.00 a year to have a lawyer represent the parishes of the Diocese. The first mediation session is expected to begin this winter. It may take several years.
