

What is Advent?

We begin a new church year November 29-30. Advent (from "ad-venire" in Latin meaning "to come to") is the joy-filled season encompassing the four Sundays leading up to the celebration of Christmas. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the fulfillment of time and to remembering Jesus' birth among us. From the earliest days of the Christmas community, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the Scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be ever alert and ready, not weighed down and distracted by extraneous notions.

Our liturgical color is purple, showing our yearning to be prepared, longing for the new, waiting for dawn, and be filled with anticipation and hope. Advent invites us to a commitment to vigilance, looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves to the needs of our brothers and sisters. We desire to witness to the Holy Dream of Christ; we witness to a new world. The prophets envision a future that is good, beautiful, and filled with love. We are heralds of a future that has already begun with the coming of Christ... God's Word made flesh. We enflesh God's Love today. God transforms our lives to usher in a new tomorrow...that Christ come through us to be peace, be joy, be hope for all. Let us look forward... becoming Advent together.


