22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time
The one who humbles himself will be exalted.

Every culture has a different understanding of sharing a meal. In first-century Palestine, a culture defined by honor and shame, sitting down to eat with another was an act of acceptance and respect. Meals affirmed the status of the invitee—usually of the same social rank as the host. But in today's Gospel we get the impression that Jesus has been invited with an ulterior motive as the Pharisees *were observing him carefully*, perhaps trying to trap him in some cultural or ritual infringement. As the meal progresses, Jesus tells two parables. Just as they were watching him, so was he observing *their* behavior. Having seen how they jockeyed for the best seats at table, he uses the image of the wedding banquet and its seating arrangements to remind them of the true meaning of humility. Perhaps this is where Sirach connects with our Gospel as it fleshes out the meaning of humility. Taken together, they remind us that real humility is grounded in seeking God's favor and placing others before ourselves. In other words, it reflects our desire to love God and neighbor. By using the banquet image and the possibility of having to give up one's seat to another of higher rank, Jesus not only highlights the potential for human embarrassment but reminds them that by initially taking the lower position there is equally the potential for greater esteem if one is brought up to a higher position. It's a very practical lesson, one that can be applied to daily living on so many levels—at home, the office, or school. It reminds us that it is not only one's social or intellectual status that is being criticized by Jesus, but how we use those gifts in our interactions with others. The one who is given the task of leadership at any level should not seek to dominate those in their care but be a servant leader—self-sacrificing and humble, relying on God for strength. They should lead with and recognize their own limitations and humanity, when compared to the all-embracing wisdom and love of God, the giver of all gifts. Saint Augustine once noted that pride was the source of all sin. If this is true, then humility is the antidote. Pride is a terminal spiritual illness for which the best medicine is a receptive heart and attentive ear enabling one to hear and reflect on wisdom, whatever its source. May God grant each one of us that receptive heart and attentive ear, that with wisdom and humility we may love one another with a sacrificial love.
